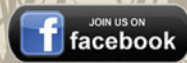

CRESTVIEW ELEMENTARY

Planting Seeds in Young Minds

The experience and wonderment of seeing seed, soil, water and sun come together to transform into a tiny green plant is a lesson in itself. By tending the garden and taking care of their environment, students at Crestview see that they are helping nature "make the magic happen."

Crestview Elementary was built in 1975. In 2010-2011, the Crestview Student Council, with the help of the Live Oak Village Garden Club, and Student Council Sponsors,

Kelly Carreon and Rebecca Sprouse, applied and won a grant from the Silver and Black Give Back Foundation (formerly the Spurs Foundation) for \$22,500 to build an outdoor classroom, including a garden. With this money, Crestview built 3 raised planting beds, an outdoor amphitheater, an outdoor chessboard, a pond and a beautiful mural. A plant cam, several alternative energy kits and instructional material was also purchased with this grant money.

The Student Council usually takes care of the vegetable garden during the year, but recently, other classes have pitched in to help. They have guest speakers from time to time and learn all about the fun and importance of gardening. Each grade is assigned a designated area of the garden to plant specific things. They haven't experienced a large harvest yet, but Ms. Sprouse states that when they do, they would like to be able to share some of the vegetables with the community.

Another great benefit the children learn in gardening is teamwork. Students need to work together to prepare the soil, plant the seeds, water the plants and stay on top of the weeding. Gardening teaches them responsibility, and working with others can build students' self-esteem. Seeing the garden flourish and produce vegetables is the sign of their success and the end product of the fruits of their labor.

NAEGLIN Farms

What better way to continue your New Year's Resolution into spring than stocking up on fresh, home grown fruits and vegetables? The Naegelin Family Farm located on 300 acres in Lytle, TX has been farming and producing over 30 different crops for over four generations. Naegelin Farm owners Sonny and Doris, along with their seven children continue the family farming tradition today. Naegelin Farms participates in Farmers Markets across the San Antonio and Central Texas area. Every Tuesday morning, rain or shine, you can find them in the parking lot of the Live Oak Civic Center located at the intersection of 1604 and Pat Booker. LIVE OAK VILLAGE Garden Club

Live Oak has had a long history with volunteer garden clubs. Many have come and gone, but the Live Oak Village Garden Club (LOVGC) has continued to do good work for the City for many years. The members belong to a larger organization called the San Antonio Garden Club that meets at the Botanical Gardens. One of their members, Lillie Denley earned the distinction of a "Master Gardener", a title that she received through training from Texas A&M University. Master Gardeners are required to attend the class, complete a test and put between 30 and 60 volunteer hours of gardening per year, for various organizations. They do work with the San Antonio Water System, the Botanical Gardens and various school science fairs. The LOVGC meets the third Tuesday of every month from 1-3pm at the Live Oak Clubhouse.

In Live Oak, The LOVGC's main project is the Xeriscape Gardens at Judson and Toepperwein, across from the Hospital. This park is currently under renovation with new and compatible plants, plans for a sidewalk as well as a gazebo that will accentuate the beauty of the park. Additional plans for the renovation calls for sandstone walking paths, additional gardens and a gazebo. The group has asked for help with the renovation from the Hospital, as well as Live Oak Economic Development Corporation, who will hopefully assist with the purchase of the gazebo. Funds from their plant sale as well as other fund raisers will go towards the project as well.

The group will be hosting their annual Spring Plant Sale on April 13th from 9am to 5pm at the Xeriscape Gardens, which will consist mainly of outdoor plants that flourish during the summer months. The Live Oak Fire Department will also have their boot on hand to collect for Muscular Dystrophy. Rental space for crafters will also be available for \$20.00 (sellers must provide their own table). Call Jo Anna Wheeler @ 210.655.1036 to reserve your space. They will also have their fall plant sale later in the year, which will focus primarily on indoor plants that will survive inside during the winter months.

The LOVGC and all the groups who have come before them have done a tremendous job beautifying areas of Live Oak that without them, had been pretty dreary. Thank you to all the members for all the work they have done for the City. The LOVGC is always looking for new members. Development Services

What you should consider when selecting a Plumbing Contractor for your home projects!

1. Obtain the name of the Responsible Master Plumber for the company. The Responsible Master Plumber's license number should be displayed in all advertisements. Master Plumber license numbers begin with the letter "M". License numbers which begin with "A", "T", "J" or any other letter are not Master Plumber license numbers.
2. Check the TSBPE website at <https://licensing.hpc.state.tx.us/datamart/mainMenu.do> to verify:
 - A. the validity of the Master Plumber license number; and
 - B. that the Master Plumber has a Certificate of Insurance on file.
3. Check with the TSBPE Enforcement Division at (800)845-6584, x 65249, to verify if the plumber has had any valid complaints filed against his or her license.
4. Check with Development Services inspection at (210)653-9140 ext. 244 or 386 to determine the following:
 - A. if any complaints have been filed that was not filed with TSBPE
 - B. if the company has met the requirements to do business in your city.
 - C. if the work to be performed requires a permit and inspection from the city.
5. The Texas State Board of Plumbing Examiners does not regulate prices charged by plumbers. Obtain several price estimates before committing to one and make sure that all warranties and cost estimates are in writing. Whether or not the estimate is for one price for the complete and final job or an hourly rate, it should be detailed enough so that the consumer understands exactly what work is to be performed and how the company expects to be paid.
6. The written estimate and invoice should contain the Responsible Master Plumber's license number, name, address and telephone number of the Texas State Board of Plumbing Examiners.
7. Obtain references and actually verify the references for previous customer satisfaction before choosing a plumber or plumbing contractors.

Severe Weather Season

The first day of spring is just around the corner and along with it comes our annual severe weather season. In 2012 we had very few instances of severe storms, and watches and warnings were seldom issued by the National Weather Service. The lack of rain and drought conditions was a bigger problem! Fortunately wildfires were not a huge problem around the state this year. The outlook for the next few months is for temperatures to remain slightly above normal and precipitation to be slightly below normal.

In regards to severe weather the months of March, April, and May tend to be our normal severe weather months. As such the

Texas Governor has proclaimed the week of March 3rd to March 9th, 2013, as "Severe Weather Awareness Week in Texas."

The National Weather Service (NWS) will issue watches and warnings whenever storms have the potential for high winds reaching 58 MPH (50 knots) and hail one (1) inch in diameter. Severe thunderstorms are also capable of producing tornadoes with little or no warning. In addition the potential for flash flooding is always a concern in and around the region. Fortunately we do not have any low water crossing in the City. Always remember the slogan "Turn Around and Don't Drown."

The best way to stay in tune with the weather is with a NOAA weather radio, available from most electronic stores. They are fairly inexpensive and can alert you to the potential for severe weather day or night. Citizens not familiar with these radios are encouraged to come by the Office of Emergency Management, located in the fire station, during normal business hours for a demonstration. SMART LANDSCAPING DETERS CRIMINALS

Spring is here and many homeowners are preparing their homes for landscaping. People forget that landscaping plays an IMPORTANT role in CRIME PREVENTION! Plants, shrubs, and outdoor lighting might not seem like crime-prevention tools, but where you plant or place outdoor lighting can make a big difference in protecting your home. Preparation on how you landscape can give burglars a place to hide.

Here are some tips to help you put plants, shrubs, and lighting where they'll benefit you and not the burglar:

DON'T plant large shrubs close to the house – especially by windows and doors. It provides a place for someone to hide.

DON'T let overgrown shrubs and plants get out of control. Overgrown shrubs could conceal criminal activity and provide hiding places.

DON'T plant bushes, shrubs, trees, etc. that blocks or obstructs your house number, this will delay emergency services from finding your home quickly.

DO plant thorny bushes under windows that are difficult for a neighbor or passerby to see -- Planting a rose bush or cactus is not what the thieves want to deal with.

DO Keep bushes, trees and other landscaping trimmed. This provides an "open" feel, making it difficult for the bad guys to hide. Keep shrubs and landscaping maintained and manicured will maximum visibility to and from your home.

DO store all your tools and ladders inside a locked storage area. Locking your tools will not aid criminals in entering your home.

DO upgrade or fix lighting that will light up your yard. Install motion-sensor lights and spotlights in dark areas. Outdoor lighting can eliminate hiding places. Install lights near entrances, porches, rear and side doors, garage doors, and any other point of entry. Place lights out of reach so the bulbs cannot be tampered with or removed. Aim some lights away from the house to see if anyone is approaching or in the area. Use energy efficient bulbs to save money. New solar activated lights are also available.

Springtime Snake Scheming

Since our newsletter is featuring Gardening in the Live Oak area, our Fire Department would like to remind our citizens to be careful of snakes. Snakes, in general, are found around a home for the specific purpose of seeking food and shelter. Keeping these things in mind provides us with guidelines to help prevent snakebites.

Keep wood piles and brush piles as far as possible from the residence. Exercise caution when working in these areas. Never put an arm or leg into something if you cannot see the bottom.

Keep storage areas as neat as possible. Treat tools and materials stored on the floor as possible snake shelters.

Treat overturned boats, tarps and similar objects as potential shelter for transient snakes moving through the area.

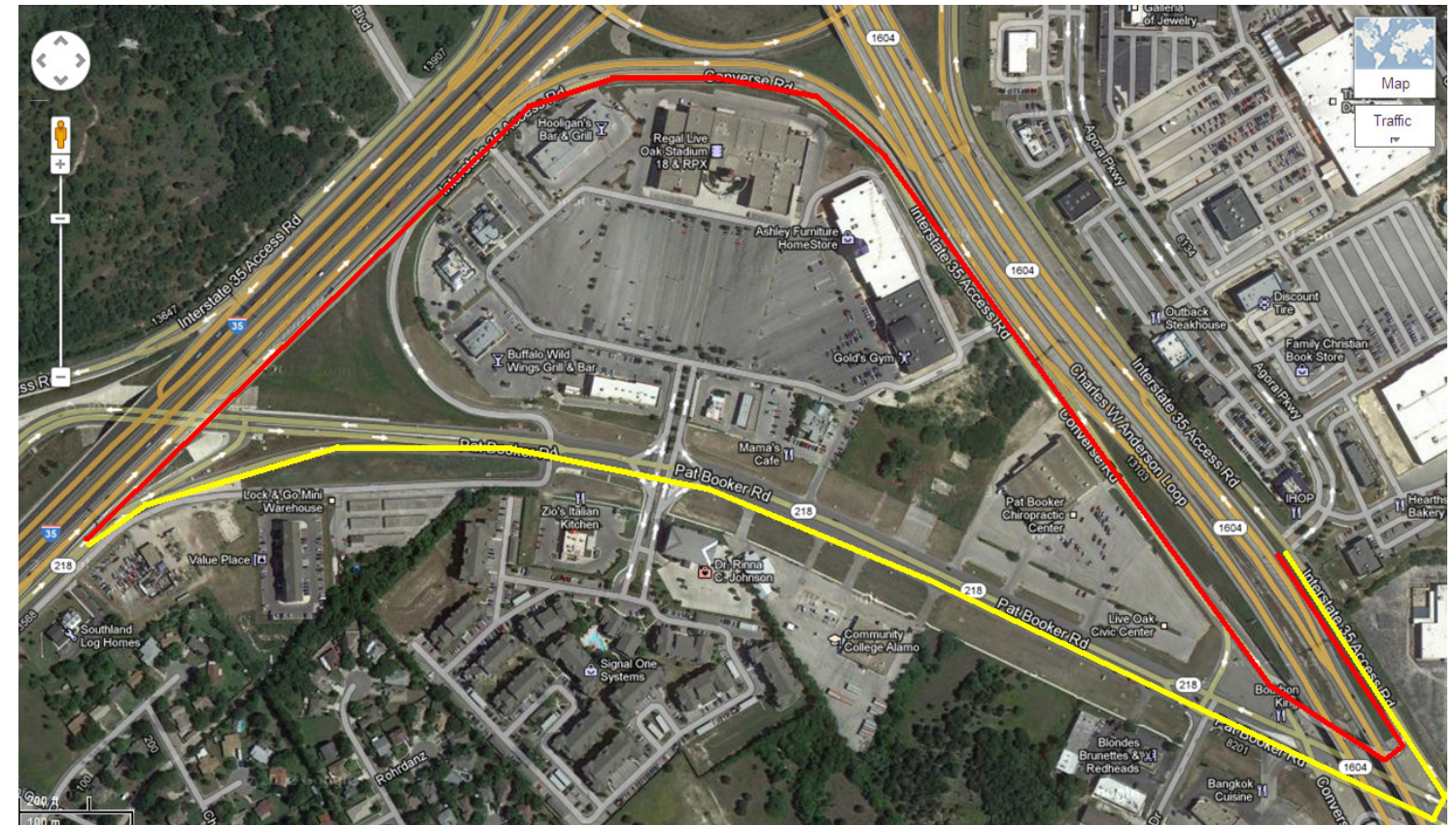
Remember that snakes are adept at finding their way through small openings. Keep this in mind when entering crawl spaces, garages and similar areas.

Recommendations have changed drastically over the years, and staying informed on effective first aid should be a priority of everyone working in a possible snake habitat. A good first-aid course from a qualified instructor should be sought.

- Assume envenomation has occurred even before symptoms appear.
- Identify the species of venomous snake with care. This could help with the medical treatment but will complicate the situation if there is more than one victim. If you cannot identify the snake, don't pursue it.
- Keep the victim as calm as possible. Keep yourself calm as well.
- Know and treat for any symptoms of shock-elevate feet, loosen clothing, etc. Wash the bite area with disinfectant soap.
- Remove constricting clothing or jewelry in the bite area. Prevent movement of the bitten extremity. Splint it, if necessary.
- Seek medical attention as soon as possible. (Call 911)



TRAFFIC MODIFICATIONS FOR NORTH-BOUND I-35/FORUM PARKWAY EXIT



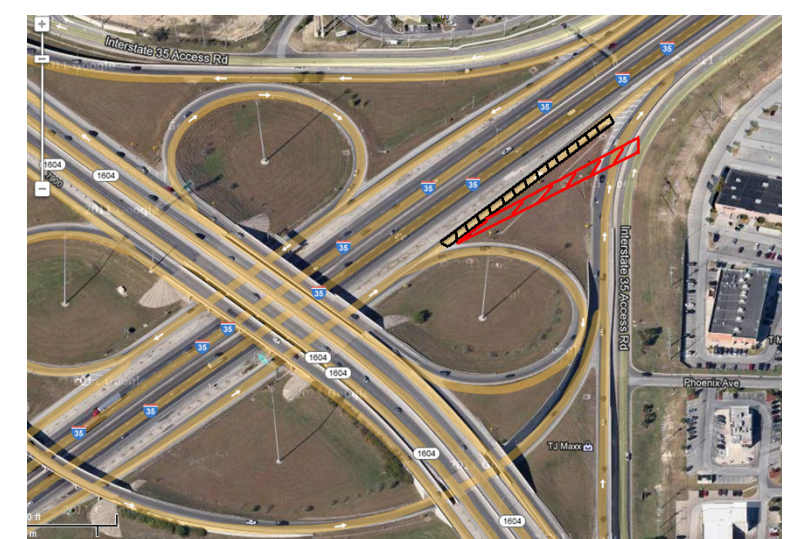
Yellow indicates the TX-Dot recommended route. Red indicates the City of Live Oak recommended route.

January 29th marked the start of some road closures to assist with construction that is intended to help our traffic patterns in the region. The north-bound exit from Interstate 35 to Forum Parkway, in Live Oak was closed for approximately six months while TXDOT contractors building a new braided-style ramp that will take care of much of the traffic congestion at this location.

The braided-style ramp will direct traffic from one direction over traffic from another, separating these competing streams of traffic. In this case, traffic to Forum Parkway will be bridged over traffic entering north-bound I-35 from Loop 1604. The design is intended to maintain safety on an increasingly utilized ramp system while addressing congestion issues.

Traffic headed to Forum Parkway from northbound IH 35 may use the eastbound Loop 1604 exit, pass behind the Live Oak Regal Cinema movie theater, and take the turn-around to Loop 1604 Westbound. Another route that TXDOT will be detouring drivers to involve exiting I-35 to Pat Booker and taking the left turn under Loop 1604. There are more than a half-dozen entry points to The Forum on the west-bound frontage road of Loop 1604.

Traffic accessing Forum Parkway from south-bound I-35 will not be affected, nor will traffic entering north-bound I-35 from Loop 1604. Traffic leaving the Forum will not have any change as well.

The work is part of a year-long effort to address congestion and maintain the safety of one of the busiest highway corridors in the San Antonio metropolitan area. We will look forward to this progress and know that the traffic will be positively impacted when it is completed.

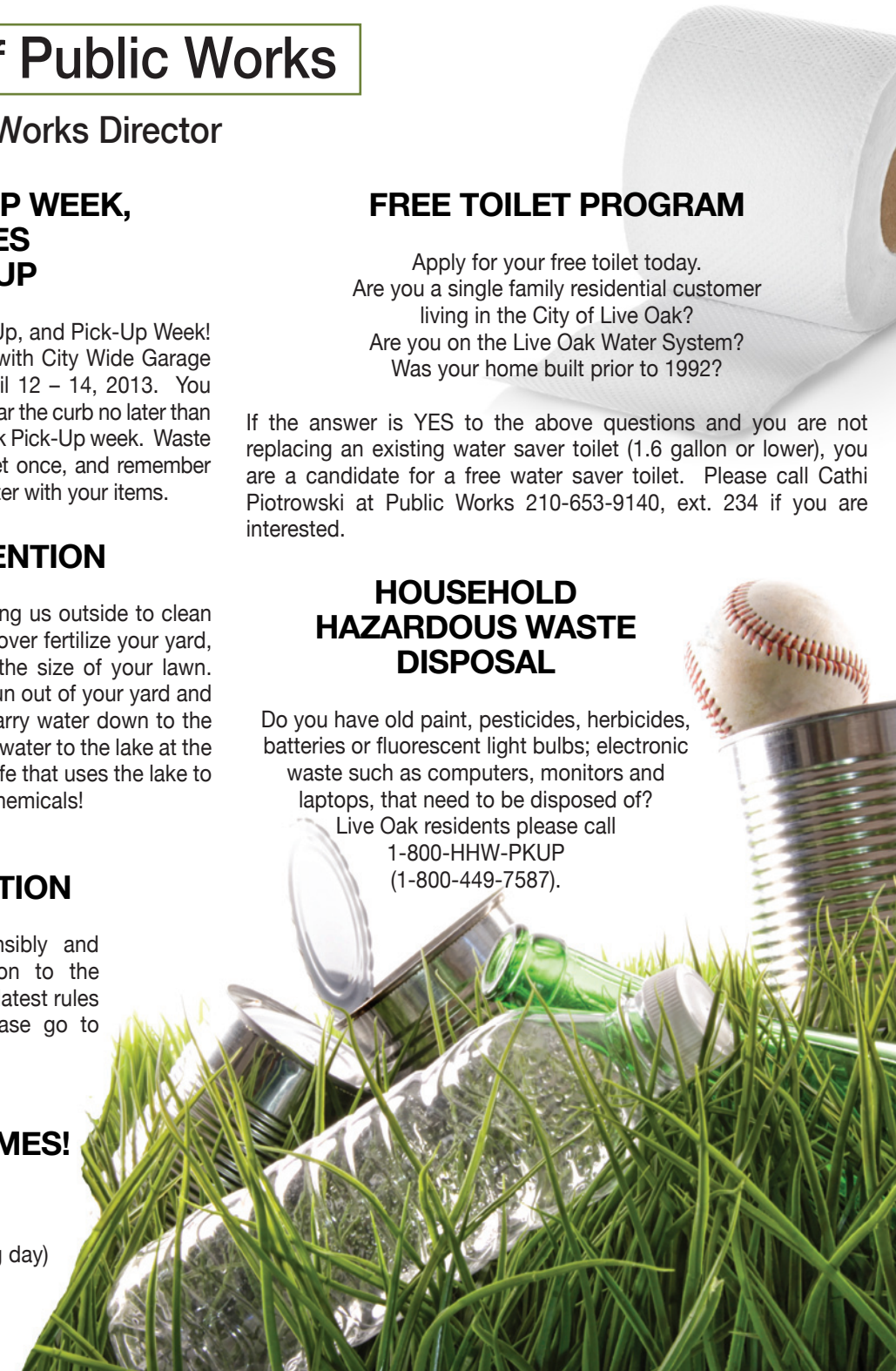

Stuffed Bell Peppers

- 6 large green peppers
- 1 small jar cheese whiz (8 oz.)
- 1 ½ pounds ground beef
- 1 can tomato sauce (16 oz.)
- ½ onion, chopped
- Salt
- 1 Tbsp. butter
- Croutons (see recipe on this page)
- 1 can mild Rotel (16oz)
- 3 cups cooked white rice

Preheat oven to 350. Cut tops off of bell peppers, clean and blanch in boiling water for five minutes. In a small skillet, sweat chopped onion in butter. In a large skillet, brown ground beef. Add onion, Rotel and cheese whiz to cooked hamburger. Simmer until cheese has blended. Spread cooked rice in 13x9 baking pan. Drain peppers and sprinkle insides lightly with salt. Place peppers on bed of rice. Scoop meat mixture into each pepper ¾ full. Drizzle tomato sauce over each pepper. Top with homemade croutons and bake for 20 minutes.

- ½ cup unsalted butter
- 1 cup milk
- 1 cup flour
- 4 cups fresh peach slices
- 2 cups sugar, divided
- 1 Tbls. Lemon juice
- 1 Tbls. Baking powder
- Ground cinnamon or nutmeg pinch of salt (add to peach mixture -optional)

Melt butter in a 13 x 9 baking dish. Combine flour, 1 cup sugar, baking powder and salt; add milk, stirring just until dry ingredients are moistened. Pour batter over butter (do not stir). Bring remaining 1 cup sugar, peach slices, and lemon juice to a boil over high heat, stirring constantly; pour over batter (do not stir). Bake at 375° for 40-45 minutes or until golden brown. Serve cobbler warm or cool.
