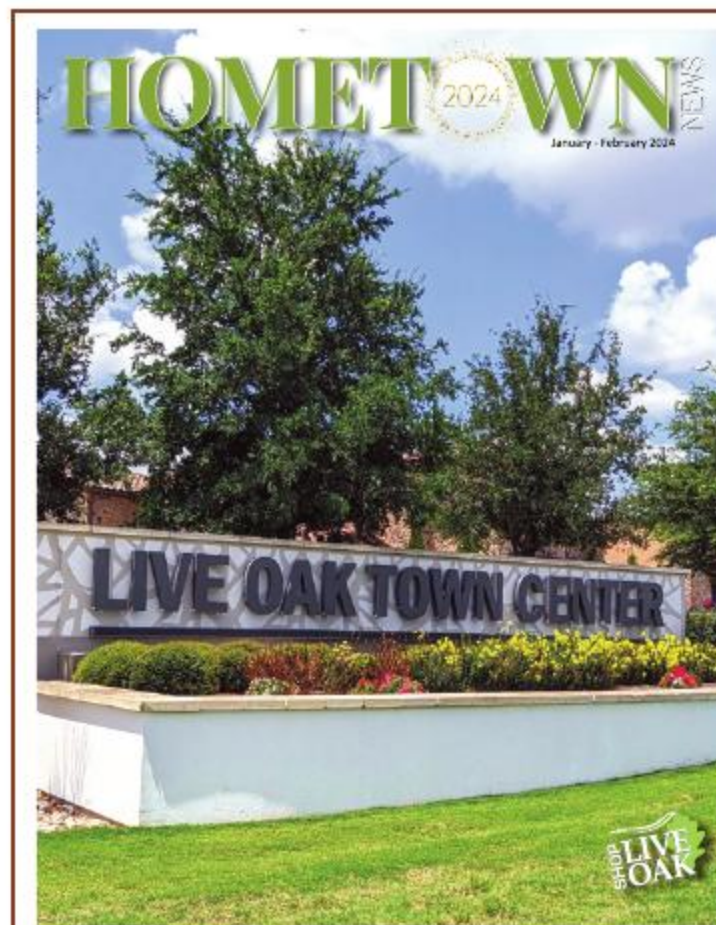

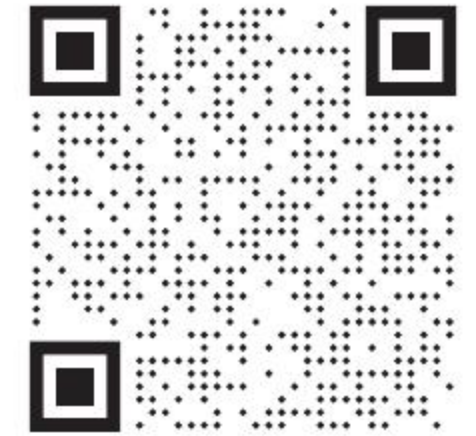

The Single Use Disposal Systems (SUDS) are a convenient and environmentally friendly way to dispose of your unused or expired prescription medications. The pre-paid **TakeAway Envelope** allows you to mail your unused and expired prescriptions from the privacy of your own home. They are incinerated unopened keeping them out of our drinking water.

As many as 92% of people have leftover medications and don't know how to dispose of them. You can lead the effort to remove unused medications by cleaning out your medicine cabinet using Single Use Disposal Systems.

Using the environmentally safe **TakeAway Envelopes** reduces the risk of unused prescription medications getting into the wrong hands and helps prevent accidental poisonings.

WHAT HAPPENS TO THE ENVELOPE AFTER IT IS MAILED?
The envelopes containing the medications are sent directly to a treatment facility to be incinerated.

2023-2024 SEWER AVERAGING



The City of Live Oak utilizes a winter averaging approach for setting a residents sewer charge.

Water consumption is typically lower during the winter months (December - February) because outdoor water usage is at a minimum. Water usage over this period will determine your sewer charge for the next billing year which begins October 1st.

The less water a resident uses during these winter months will help reduce the sewer portion of their utility bill.

A resident's winter average is determined by simply averaging the water usage over these winter months. This winter average is then multiplied by a variable/usage rate of \$2.98 per 1,000 gallons of usage. This amount is then added to a base/fixed rate of \$14.19 to get your total sewer charge.

As an example....
If your winter average for water usage was determined to be 5,620 gallons, your sewer charge will be calculated as follows:
5.620 (thousand gallons) x \$2.98 per 1,000 gallons = \$16.75
plus the base/fixed rate of \$14.19 = \$30.94.
This would be the sewer charge for 12 months starting with the October billing.

This past year we were able to see the completion of several projects, and the realization of goals met. One of the most exciting transformations that has occurred in the Live Oak Main Park is the complete renovation of the old Hilltop Playground. Demolition of the old playground began late this past summer with the Parks Department

removing the old structures and rubber mulch fall zone material. Once the site was a “fresh slate” the contractors came in and began prep work for this new ultramodern playground. This expanded play area boasts two picnic sites and five bench pads located within the newly poured sidewalk and fenced areas. In addition to one of the most amazing climbing and play structures in the region there is also a fitness zone located by the round pavilion for our park patrons to enjoy. Following the woody, natural theme of the Acorn Playground, this all-inclusive, treehouse play area is sure to be a big hit for years to come!



Both of our pavilions received an overhaul this year and continue to remain a top amenity for park goers. The round pavilion experienced a thorough power washing along with new painting inside and out. The rectangular pavilion has undergone much more extensive renovation. The support poles were prepped and painted, and an all-new tin roof was installed. The existing concrete slab was removed, and a fresh, larger slab was poured. Two green shade sails along with a sidewalk for connectivity enhance the picnic experience and have truly transformed this aging pavilion and surrounding area.

During 2023, the Parks and Recreation crews devoted countless hours to the ongoing tree removal and replanting process in parks. The trees that were lost to freeze and drought were removed from the city parks and native trees were bought for replanting. The variety of species visitors can enjoy are Live Oak, Monterrey Oak, Vitex, and Crepe Myrtles. These newly planted trees have been carefully tended to and will supply benefits to the community for years to come.

The Live Oak Police Department (LOPD) is making substantial changes to their video evidence system. LOPD will be transitioning to a company called Utility Inc.®. After a demonstration of capabilities, we learned that they have capabilities that exceeded what was being offered by our previous video evidence system. The proposal included new in-car video systems, new body cameras, retrofits to uniforms, and it provided cost-savings to the city. Utility, Inc. will provide officers with an intuitive platform for effectively capturing, managing, and releasing video evidence.

THIS UPDATE IN TECHNOLOGY WILL INCLUDE:

- A cloud-based system to maximize redundancy in case of an outage and makes releasing critical footage quickly and effortless.
- Allows multiple videos to be shown from different devices simultaneously in the same interface. In addition, the GPS data from each incident will provide situational awareness of patrol vehicles and officers on a live map view.
- Detects the moment a firearm is removed from its holster and sends real-time alerts to dispatch and nearby officers when seconds mean lives and intelligence matters.
- It also has an officer down feature, if an officer falls to the ground, after several seconds, it will start recording and alert dispatch and other officers of the officer's location.

Utility Inc. will ultimately help promote accountability and transparency. The synchronization of body cameras will provide an objective record of interactions between police officers and the public. This visual evidence system will offer insights into the sequence of events during incidents, help corroborate witness testimonies, and provide a more comprehensive understanding of complex situations. Finally, Utility can be used for training and professional development purposes to contribute to improved policing practices. We can review the recorded interactions to identify areas for improvement, assess officer performance, and implement targeted training programs. By analyzing real-life scenarios captured on body camera footage, LOPD will be able to enhance their officers' skills in communication, conflict resolution, and adherence to policies, ultimately leading to safer interactions with the public.



Now that the holidays are over, what about the Christmas tree?

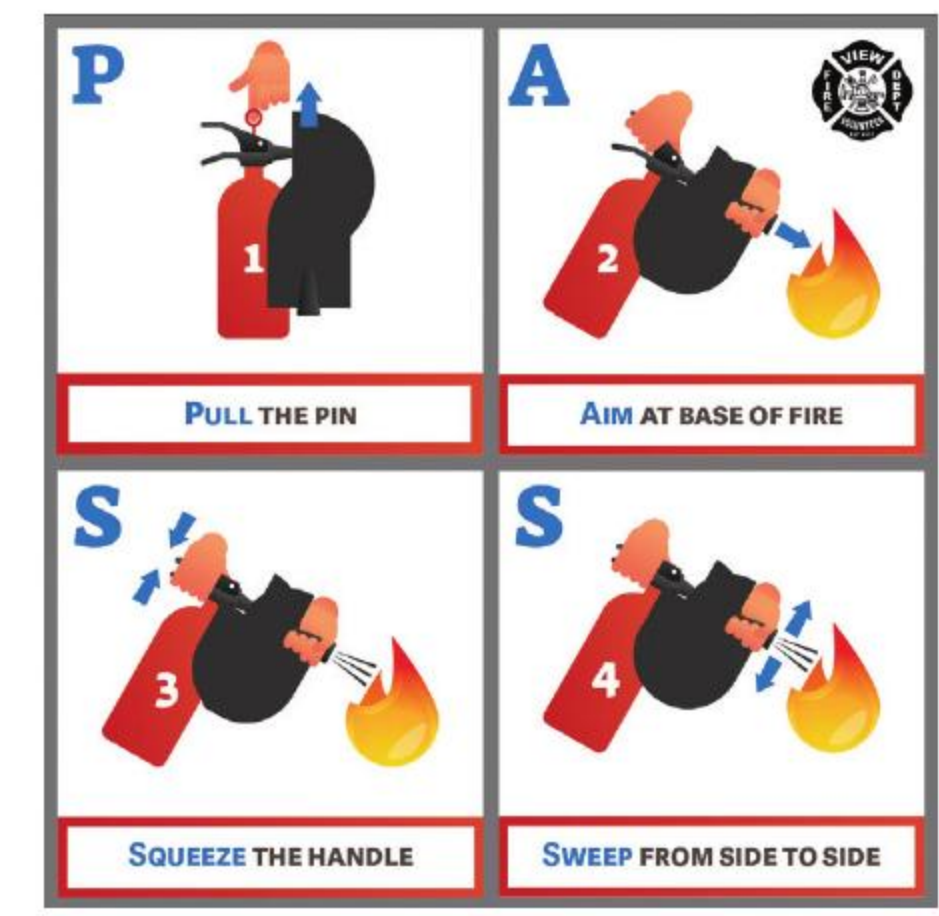
Taking down the Christmas tree is not nearly as much fun as putting it up. However, the longer a tree stays up, the greater the fire hazard it becomes.

- It is best to discard live trees within one month after purchase.
 - When Christmas is over or the tree begins to drop needles, dispose of it.
 - **Do not store live trees in the house or garage.**
 - **NEVER** burn Christmas trees, evergreen branches, or needles in a fireplace or wood stove.
 - Firs and pines have a lot of sap, which can explode. Needles burn like tinder.

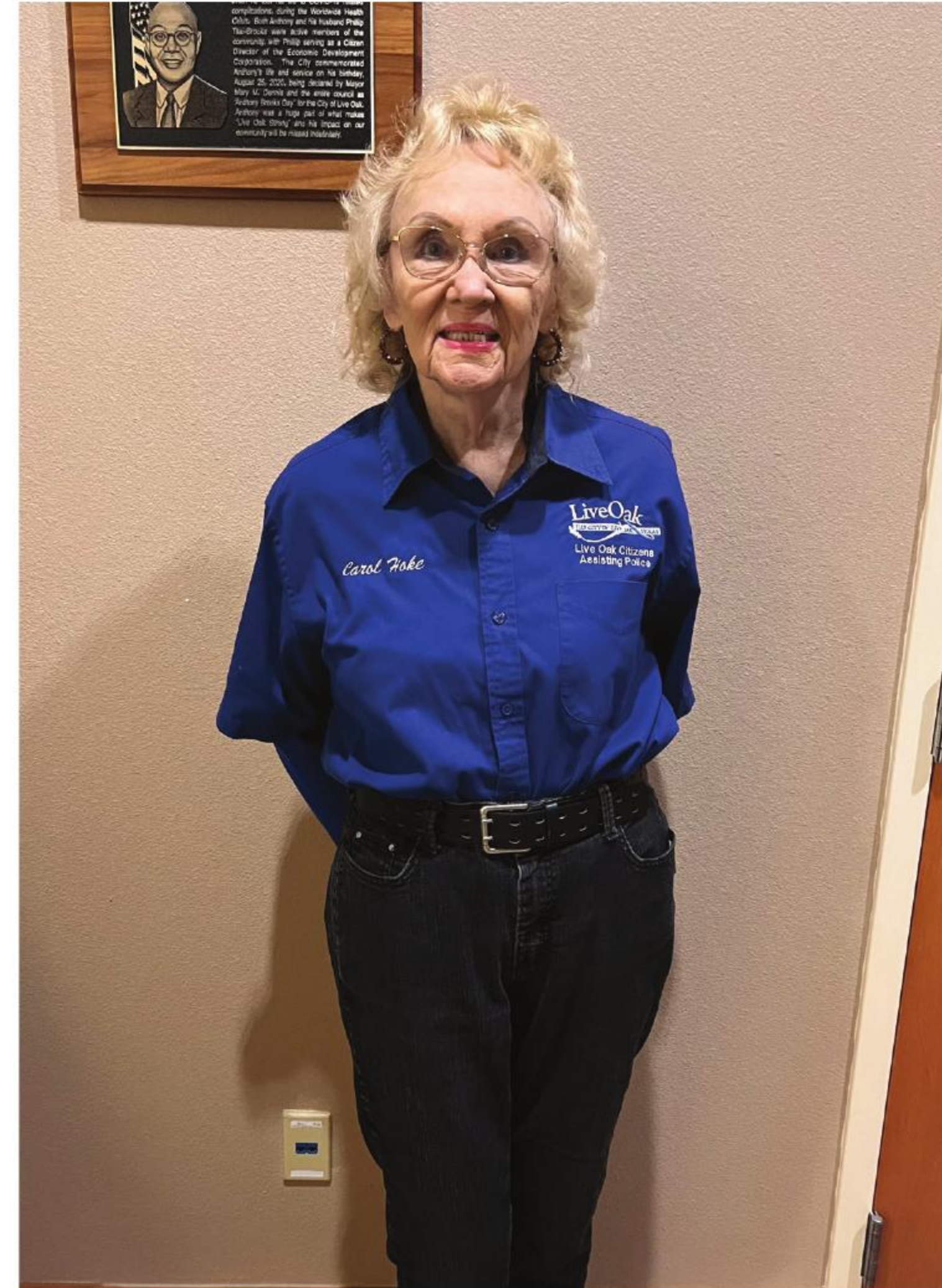

Things You Can Do To Avoid Frozen Pipes

Texas weather is unpredictable. But, you can be prepared! Now that winter is upon us, protecting your home from unexpected damage is imperative. Here are some pre-winter weather tips to help you avoid costly damage from unexpected winter weather.

Disconnect Garden Hoses

Disconnect, drain, and store garden hoses. Close any shut-off valves that supply outdoor hose bibs and open the faucet outside to drain the line. Follow manufacturer guidelines to drain water from any sprinkler supply lines.

Insulate Your Pipes

Consider insulating any pipes located in unheated areas, such as in the attic, basement, crawl spaces, or garage. In extreme cold, pipes underneath kitchen and bathroom sinks are also vulnerable to freezing. Apply foam insulation liberally to provide a buffer against frigid temperatures.

Seal Any Air Leaks

Inspect your home for any cracks or holes that allow cold air in. Seal them up along with any openings around pipes.

Open Interior Doors And Cabinets

Allow heat to circulate throughout your home by keeping doors and cabinets open. Remember to remove harmful chemicals or items that can be accessed by children or pets.

Let Faucets Drip

Letting water flow within the pipes helps prevent the water inside them from freezing. It will also prevent pipes from rupturing if the water inside them does happen to freeze.

Keep A Consistent Temperature

Set your thermostat to a consistent temperature day and night. If you will not be home for a long period of time, set your thermostat to at least 55, to avoid costly damage to your pipes while you are away.
