As we celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Live Oak Fire Department, it is always nice to look at the past to see how the fire service has evolved in the United States.

In 1736, Benjamin Franklin established the Union Fire Company in Philadelphia, but the United States did not have government-run fire departments until American Civil War time period.



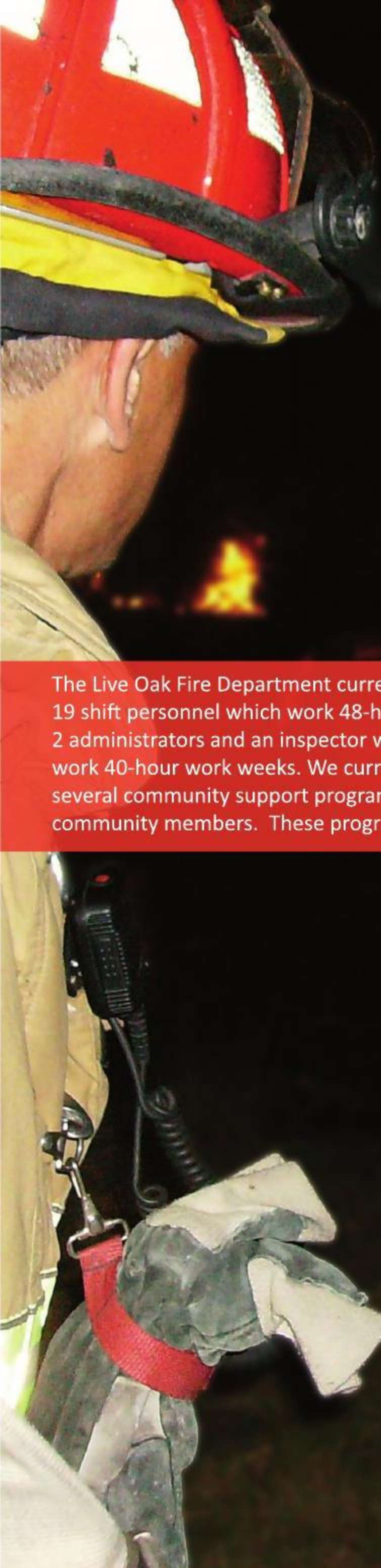
The first known female firefighter was Molly Williams in 1818. On April 1, 1853 the first 100 percent professional fire department was formed in Cincinnati. Since 1922, the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) has sponsored the public observance of Fire Prevention week. In 1925, President Calvin Coolidge

proclaimed Fire Prevention Week a national observance, making it the longest- running public health observance in our country.

As of 2015, 70 percent of the fire service is made up of volunteers. To become a firefighter in the State of Texas, you must first obtain a Firefighter certification from the Texas Commission on Fire Protection (TCFP) which can

be done by attending any accredited fire academy. Also, you must obtain an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) certification from the Department of State Health Services.

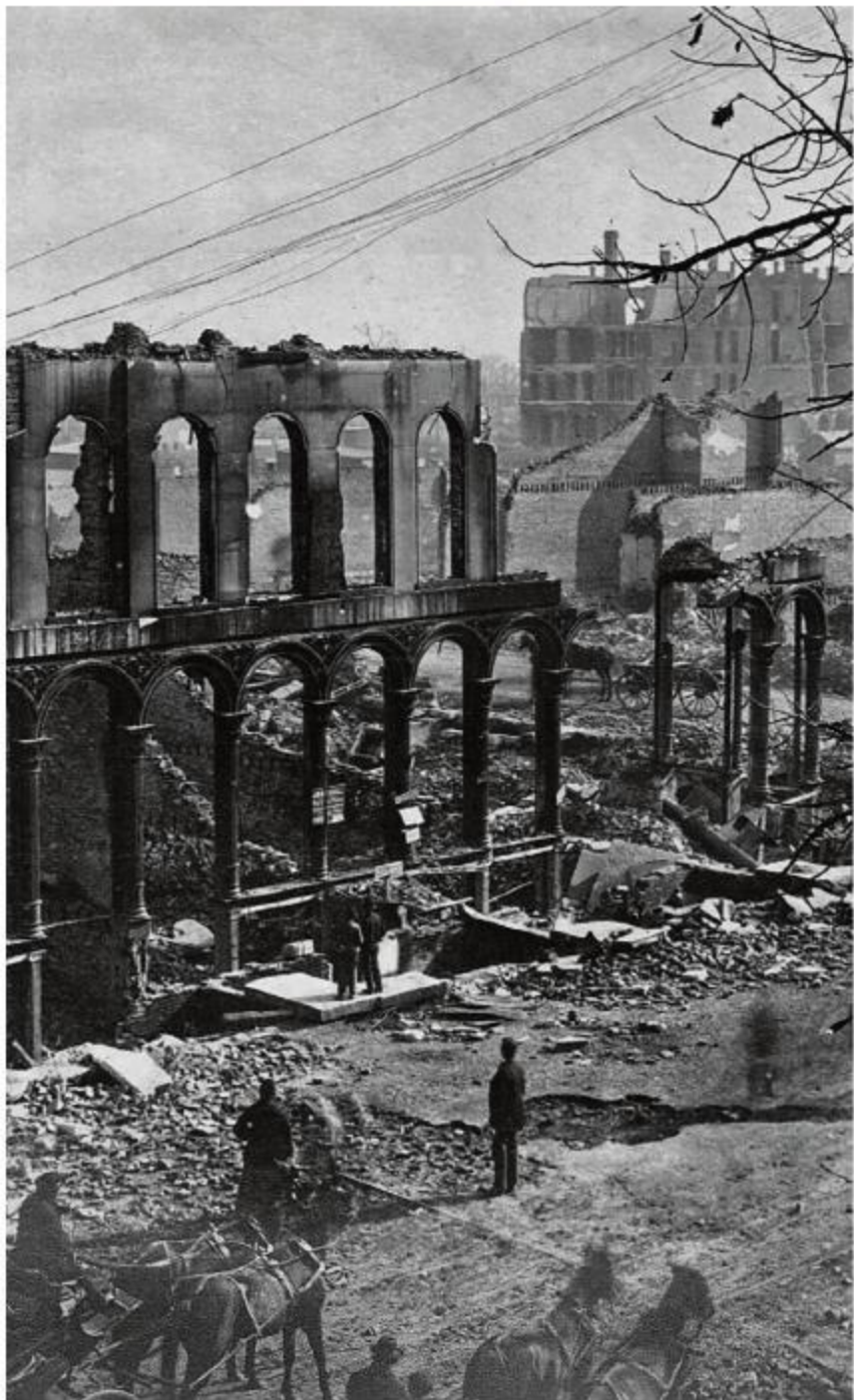

Fire Prevention Week is observed each year during the week of October 9th in commemoration of the Great Chicago Fire, which began on October 8, 1871, and caused devastating damage. This horrific conflagration killed more than 250 people, left 100,000 homeless, destroyed more than 17,400 structures, and burned more than 2,000 acres of land.



During Fire Prevention Week, children, adults, and teachers learn how to stay safe in case of a fire. Firefighters provide lifesaving public education in an effort to drastically decrease casualties caused by fires.

Almost half (44%) of reported home fires started in the kitchen, and two-thirds (66%) of home cooking fires start with the ignition of food or other cooking materials.



You may see a different approach to Fire Prevention Week and the 9/11 Memorial this year due to the current pandemic, however the Fire Department will do their best to get the community educated on fire and accident prevention, as well as NEVER FORGETTING the events on September 11, 2001.



Let us be safe, remember to wear your face mask, and NFPA recommends that smoke alarms batteries be changed at least once (1) a year. If that alarm chirps, warning the battery is low, replace the battery right away. Your Live Oak Police Department consists of 50 dedicated men and women assigned as administrative staff, communications officers and sworn police officers. We are more than a police department. We are part of the community. Your Live Oak Police Department is here to serve and protect as any other police department is, but so much more.

With the recent civil unrest caused by some very tragic events, the media has portrayed all police officers as evil thugs. Some bad things were done by a few officers and they will now have to answer for their actions in a court of law. Please understand that not all officers should be viewed in a negative light. A bad apple does not ruin the entire bushel.

The Live Oak Police Department and its officers take great pride in operating in a professional manner. All officers are trained in civilian interaction, deescalation, crisis intervention, use of force, cultural diversity, and racial profiling. These courses are just a few of what each officer must successfully complete to maintain their Texas Peace Officer License.

Officers in the department also spend time interacting with the public. COVID-19 has curtailed this temporarily, but the department had regularly scheduled events such as Coffee with Cops, Citizens Police Academy, Junior Police Academy, National Night Out, Blue Santa, and Cookies with Cops. The department also participates in city events such as parades, Safe Halloween, Christmas in the Park, Movie in the Park, and Daddy Daughter Dance. Officers also volunteer their time to participate and raise money for Special Olympics, and Muscular Dystrophy.

The department gained accreditation through the Texas Police Chiefs Association in 2015. By gaining that accreditation the department follows the Texas Best Practices for Policing. This means that all department policies have been reviewed and approved by the Chiefs Association. We must follow all guidelines set by the association and we must complete a successful audit bi-annually to maintain our accredited status.

One of these policies requires officers to report and the department to maintain all use of force incidents in which any person is injured, or a less lethal or lethal weapon is deployed. All incidents are documented and reviewed to ensure that there was no excessive force used, criminal acts committed, or civil rights violated.

Police officers are no different than anyone else. We are people. We are part of the community. Our goal is to make Live Oak a safe, enjoyable place to live, work and play. So next time you see an officer driving down the street, wave at them. They will wave back. They are your neighbors.

What's In Your Heaven?

Finding the right way to express your condolences to someone who has recently lost a loved one or trying to ease your own pain from a loss is very difficult at times. Whether it be for the loss of a loved one or a beloved pet, the pain can be the same intensity and leave most humans, young and old, feeling sad and full of questions asking why?

In July, Paige Osborn, one of Live Oak's longtime employees, authored and published a book called "What's In Your Heaven?" to help answer some of those questions and provide helpful tips in dealing with grief. As an avid dog lover, Paige fostered many sick or injured dogs over the years. She would herself endure the loss of pets and family members along the way. With her experience, she wanted to provide a tool that would help people with the heartbreak after a great loss. Code Corner

It's summertime and the living's easy..

Just a friendly reminder from the City of Live Oak Code Compliance office to make sure any vehicles parked on your property follow the city's code. Section 302.8 of the Code of Ordinances does not allow inoperative or unlicensed motor vehicles to be kept or stored on any premises.

What exactly makes a vehicle inoperative or unlicensed?

Listed are examples of an inoperative or unlicensed vehicle: expired or no registration, missing license plate, flat tire(s), in disrepair, wrecked, abandoned, and/or incapable of being moved under its own power.

Additionally, the code does not allow vehicles to be parked on an unpaved surface. Paved surfaces include pavement, concrete, asphalt, or pavers. Any vehicles parked, even partially on the grass are in violation of Section 302.8.

We look forward to your help in keeping the City of Live Oak, Texas looking beautiful for your neighbors and visitors. From your friendly neighborhood Code Compliance office, thank you for your help and have a great summer!

TRAPPING

Are you having a problem with wild animals or feral/stray animals tearing up your garden or property this season? Please come by Live Oak Animal Control and let us help you get your life back! We have a service which we provide to our wonderful Live Oak residents by loaning out traps for this very purpose. Loaned out live traps must be returned to the facility every Friday as there is no trapping over weekends or holidays. You set it, and we will come and pick up these critters for you at no cost and return the traps if you are still having issues. When you are finished with our services, simply return the trap to our facility or we can pick it up for you. Money back in your pocket from property no longer being torn up and your animal issues are gone. If in the event you have an extraordinary number of strays or wildlife encroaching on your lifestyle, the staff at animal control are capable of coming by and setting multiple traps on your property for your convenience at no cost to you. Please come by our office or call for more in-depth details! We are so happy to work with our residents and help you with any animal issues you may be having. Please remember that feeding animals such as wildlife, feral/stray animals is against Live Oak City Ordinances. Please call if you have any questions or concerns or if you are in need of our services!



BULKY TRASH PICK UP

The semi-annual Bulky Trash Pick Up begins September 28, 2020.

Please follow the guidelines below to have your large, unwanted “treasures” picked up:

- Place bulky items along the curb by Sunday evening, September 27th
- Examples of acceptable bulky items include: chairs, sofas, mattresses, tables, water heaters, and lawn furniture.
- The following items are unacceptable and will not be picked up: No Brush, No Televisions, No Computers, No Monitors, No Refrigerators, No Window Units, No Portable Air Conditioners or anything that contains Freon, No Tires, No Batteries, No Glass, No Hazardous Waste and No more than 2.5 cubic yards of Residential Construction Debris.
- Items cannot be placed at the curb before Tuesday, September 22nd.
- Waste Management will only pass by once. Please remember not to cover the sidewalk or water meter with your items, and do not park along the curb near the bulky items.

Conserve Wisely!

When in Stage 1, outdoor watering with a sprinkler or irrigation system is allowed only before 11 a.m. and after 7 p.m., one day per week, as determined by the last number of your street address.

0 or 1 – Mondays
2 or 3 – Tuesdays
4 or 5 – Wednesdays

6 or 7 – Thursdays
8 or 9 – Fridays
(No watering on weekends with a sprinkler or irrigation system)



Stage 1

Restrictions begin when the aquifer level drops to 660 feet mean sea level at the monitored well. Areas without a street address, such as medians and neighborhood entryways, water on Wednesday. Watering days begin at midnight, overnight watering is not allowed. However, watering with a handheld hose is still allowed any day, any time.

Stage 2

Restrictions begin when the 10-day rolling average of the aquifer level drops to 650 feet mean sea level at the monitored well. All restrictions from Stage 1 remain in effect, unless added to or replaced by Stage 2 rules. Coming out of drought stages can be considered 15 days after the aquifer is above the trigger.

Watering with an irrigation system or sprinkler is allowed only once a week from 7-11 a.m. and 7-11 p.m. on your designated watering day. For more detailed information on Stage 2, please visit www.saws.org.



Trimming Oak Trees?

Did you know the best time to prune oaks is when trees are dormant from November to January 30th. That's because sap beetles, insects that spread oak wilt, are most active from February to August. Please make sure all tree wounds or fresh cuts are sprayed within 30 minutes or less. Pruning paint with pesticide is the best defense but a spray paint can also be used. The pesticide pruning spray paint to treat fresh cuts or wounds on your Oak is available upon request. Call Cathi at 210-653-9140, ext. 2234 for more information about oak wilt and how you can check out the paint while trimming.
