The attached Quarterly Investment Report represents a snapshot of the City's investment status as of the third quarter ending June 30, 2024. The remainder of this memo describes in words, that which is contained in the detailed report. This report is required to be presented and accepted by the governing body at least quarterly.

Internal Management Reports

No less than quarterly, the investment officer shall prepare and submit to the governing body of the entity a written report of investment transactions for all funds.

The report must:

- 1) Describe the investment position of the entity on the date of the report.
- 2) Be prepared jointly and signed by all investment officers of the entity.
- 3) Contain a summary statement prepared in compliance with generally accepted accounting principles for each pooled fund group that states:
 - a) A beginning market value, additions and changes to the market value, the ending market value and fully accrued interest.
 - b) State the pooled fund group.

History of Public Funds Investment Act (Chapter 2256 Government Code)

In 1994, Orange County, California went bankrupt attempting to leverage its finances through exotic interest-rate-sensitive investments. Beaumont, Texas had problems in the same time period with pledged securities. To assure what happened in California would not happen here; the Texas Legislature revised the Texas Public Funds Investment Act to place new safeguards on the investments of public funds.

The Act requires the investment officers to attend various training sessions and require the governing bodies of the investing entity to adopt a written investment policy; and for all those who do business with the City to review the City's investment policies and strategies with acknowledgement that they have read and understood the requirements by a signed document.

Investment officers must review the new legislation yearly and revise their investment policies and strategies accordingly and to re-submit to the governing body within six months after the end of each legislative session.

Economic & Market Commentary Conditions for the Quarter

Source is the TexPool newsletters from April through June 2024.

The Feds continue to hold the rate steady at 5.25%-5.50%. The bigger question still remains what does the remainder of 2024 look like? Originally there was speculation that the Feds would drop the rate 75 basis points of rate cuts in 2024. There still is simply too much uncertainty in the economy and the Feds acted in caution. The language from the Fed Chairman indicated that rates cuts are not a current topic right now. There is speculation of maybe one rate cut of 25 basis points before the year end being that it is an election year.

The optimism of the market and the cautiousness of the Fed will hopefully align sooner than later. Who is actually correct about the path of policy in 2024 will not be known until the first cut actually comes.

Analysis of the Quarterly Investment Report

The following is a summary of TexPool

Weighted average maturity in April was 40 days.

Weighted average maturity in May was 40 days.

Weighted average maturity in June was 36 days.

Daily interest rates ranged from 5.3166% on April 1, 2024 to 5.3249% on June 30, 2024 with a high of 5.3270% on May 31, 2024 – June 2, 2024 and the low of 5.2930% on June 3, 2024.

The current market condition is continuing to lend itself for the purchase of some government agencies, Certificates of Deposit and Municipal investments; although, we did not purchased any investment this quarter. We had three maturities totaling \$900,000 this quarter. We had no calls this quarter. Total government agencies, CDs and Municipal notes held at June 30, 2024 is \$10,085,000 or 20.52% of the total City portfolio. The reason the percentage is not higher is because TexPool is a very viable investment tool with daily short-term rates now over 5% due to the current rate environment that we are in.

The weighted average maturity for investments outside of TexPool at March 31, 2024 was 243.42 days or 0.68 years with yields to maturity ranging from 1.000% to 5.200%. Our ratio between our book value versus market value has increased from the previous quarter but is still less than when we purchased the investments which means that the market value of the investments we hold is currently worth less than what we paid for them although principal value to maturity remains at 100%. The market value is associated to the swing in interest rates caused by market conditions.

With TexPool continuing to be a viable investment vehicle, 79.48% of the City's funds remain very safe in TexPool. The offset to lower risk is slightly lower interest rates. Texpool's interest rates have stabilized around the 5.3% but tend to lag behind the true market. The current market condition continues to be conducive for Bank CD's, Agency Discount Notes, Municipals and Callable Agencies with less than three-year final maturity, as well as, TexPool.

RESOLUTION NO. ____

A RESOLUTION BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LIVE OAK, TEXAS AUTHORIZING THE USE OF JOINT BASE SAN ANTONIO FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES FOR TRAINING PURPOSES AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER OR THE CITY MANAGER'S DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE A HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT WITH FOR THE PURPOSE OF USING THEIR FACILITIES; AUTHORIZING ANY ADDITIONAL ACTIONS REASONABLY NECESSARY THEREWITH; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Live Oak believes it is in the best interests of the City to use the fire and emergency training facilities at Joint Base San Antonio Fire and Emergency Services; and

WHEREAS, Joint Base San Antonio Fire and Emergency Services is willing to allow the employees of Live Oak use said facilities for fire and emergency safety training; and

WHEREAS, Joint Base San Antonio Fire and Emergency Services requires all users of said facilities to sign a standard Release and Hold Harmless Agreement, which is attached as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the City Council hereby finds that it is in the best interest of the City for its employees to use said facilities and to enter into the Hold Harmless Agreement insofar as it is reasonable and necessary for the health, safety and welfare of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the City Manager or his designee may enter into the Hold Harmless Agreement and take any additional actions reasonably necessary to ensure such Agreement is executed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LIVE OAK, TEXAS THAT:

- Section 1. The City Council hereby approves the use of the fire and emergency training facilities at Joint Base San Antonio for its employees and approves and accepts the Hold Harmless Agreement as set out in **Exhibit "A."**
- Section 2. The City Manager, or his designee, is hereby authorized to execute the Hold Harmless Agreement, on behalf of the City, and such other documents and instruments reasonably necessary to conclude the transaction.
- Section 3. All resolutions, or parts thereof, which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Resolution shall be and remain controlling as to the matters resolved herein.

- This Resolution shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the Section 4. laws of the State of Texas and the United States of America.
- If any provision of this Resolution or the application thereof to any person Section 5. or circumstance shall be held to be invalid, the remainder of this Resolution and the application of such provision to other persons and circumstances shall nevertheless be valid, and the City Council hereby declares that this Resolution would have been enacted without such invalid provision.
- It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which Section 6. this Resolution is adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place, and subject matter of the public business to be considered at such meeting, including this Resolution, was given, all as required by Chapter 551, Texas Government Code, as amended.

This Resolution shall be in force and effect from and after its final passage, and it Section 7. is so resolved.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

FROM: JOINT BASE SAN ANTONIO FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES
SUBJECT: Agreement to Release and Hold Harmless
1. Members of theFire Department wishing to participate in Live Fire/Rescue training at any of the three Joint Base San Antonio Fire Emergency Services (JBSA-FES) training grounds, have been made fully aware of the nature of Live Fire/Rescue training and the risks involved with participation, including, but not limited to:
a. That Live Fire/Rescue training is physically strenuous and inherently dangerous, and that Live Fire training is potentially hazardous.
 Risks associated with Live Fire training include bums, smoke inhalation, vomiting, circulatory or neurological injury, loss of consciousness, and possible death.
2. Members of theFire Department, in consideration for participation in Live Fire/Rescue training at JBSA-FES, and knowing all of the risks associated with such participation, shall indemnify, defend, release, hold harmless and forever discharge the United States Government, United States Air Force, the Department of Defense and all agents, employees and representatives thereof, acting officially or unofficially, from any and all liability actions, causes of action, claims and demands for, upon, or by reason of any loss, damage, injury, or death which may be sustained by members of my department, arising out of, incidenta to or as a consequence of participation in Live Fire training at JBSA-FES. I certify that members of theFire Department are performing this action voluntarily and that they are solely at risk for any loss, damage or injury sustained, whether said risk is known or unknown, foreseen or unforeseen.
3. "Insofar as this agreement may be inconsistent with the waiver of claims provisions contained in any reciprocal agreement for mutual aid in furnishing fire protection heretofore or hereafter entered into by theFire Department with any agency of the United States pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1856a, the rights and obligations of the parties will be governed by said waiver of claims provision and not by this agreement."
4. Prior to being permitted to participate in Aircraft, Structural or Flashover live fire training or any Aircraft egress, technical rescue or Pre-planned exercises I acknowledge that all individuals have received training on the following and meet minimum standards set by the local, state, or federal authority having jurisdiction meeting basic Firefighter certifications in accordance with

National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Standard 1001; Safety, Fire Behavior, Personnel

Protective Equipment (PPE), Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA), Fire Hose, Appliances and Streams.

5. I also acknowledge that the PPE to include SCBA being used is NFPA compliant and any damage resulting while in use is the sole responsibility of the department having jurisdiction and not of JBSA-FES whether said risk is known or unknown, foreseen or unforeseen.
