1. CALL TO ORDER

Councilman Mendell D. Morgan Jr., Animal Advisory Liaison called the Animal Control Board to order at 9:00 a.m.

3. CONSENT AGENDA

A. Minutes - May 23, 2017

A motion was made by Chief Hooper to approve the Consent Agenda; seconded by Mr. Phillips

4. NEW BUSINESS

A. Discussion regarding the progress and plans for the Animal Control building.

Mr. Phillips indicated that everything is moving along well with the dropped ceiling and new windows and ventilation system

B. Discussion regarding the progress of the City of Converse Animal Control Facility.

Mr. Phillips indicated that there was no new construction on the Animal Control Facility in Converse; the location of the facility is near the cemetery by Judson High School football field.

C. Discussion regarding regulating fowl in the City.

Mr. Phillips indicated the State Legislature did not approve this item and the City Ordinance will apply.

- D. Discussion regarding the Yearly Report (Number of animals picked up, adopted, in foster care.)

As of September 30, 2017 there were a total of 997 animal processed. Converse had a total of 88 (Dog/Cats) animals processed, 29 animals adopted, 120-262 animals returned to owners and a total of 59 euthanized. In addition, there have been multiple sightings of coyotes on city property.

- E. Discussion regarding the 2017 Pet-Paw-Looza Event.

Kaci Scholten, Humane Society President indicated that this event was very successful and thanked the park employees, Police Department and Ms. Matney for their assistance. In addition, the event raised over \$800.00, two on site adoptions that included four rescue animals. Lastly, she indicated that maybe the next Pet-Paw-Looza Event would be planned for a different date, due to the Fire Parade.

Councilman Morgan thanked all the LO Humane Society people who participated in the event.

5. ADVISORY REPORT

- A. Staff remarks

Mr. Phillips thanked his staff for their hard work and dedication. In addition, there was a need for volunteers to walk the dog, but volunteers needed to be 18 years or older.

- C. Live Oak Humane Society remarks

Ms. Woodall, Humane Society Volunteer stated that she was very pleased with all that the City and Police Department was contributing.

- A. The next Animal Advisory board meeting will be Tuesday April 24, 2018 at 9:00 a.m.


7. ADJOURNMENT
