The first is the Director of Public Works, Mark Wagster. He leads a group of amazing employees to provide Live Oak residents and businesses with essential public works services such as water, sewer, drainage, streets, traffic safety, parks, recreation, and special events. His team provides support for police, fire, and other departments by maintaining the buildings and the city fleet. Mark loves this work because he interacts with concerned residents, and employees on a daily basis. He is a problem solver, decision maker, motivator, coach, counselor, and humble leader. Mark has been with the city of Live Oak for 42 years, serving the last 27 years as a department head.

He has worked alongside 7 city managers, 8 mayors, a couple of dozen city council members, and he still looks forward to going to work every day. He shares his life with his beautiful wife Beth. They enjoy swimming in the backyard pool, dining out, concerts, movies, musicals, and trips to the beach. He cherishes any time that he can spend with daughter Kayleigh, son Christopher with wife Samantha, granddaughter Addison, and son Matthew with wife Monique, and grandsons Austin, and Mason.

Mark cannot get enough of the "great outdoors." He is an avid saltwater angler, wade fishing the bays along the coast in South Texas chasing after large redfish, trout, and flounder. He attributes a great deal of his success to guidance from some key people along the way. His parents, Dorothy and Bernie Wagster, raised him in a loving Christian home. He has had great mentors that took him under their wings such as Heinz Mueller, former Director, and City managers, Doug Faseler, Joe Painter, and Scott Wayman. He considers them all his role models and describe them as great bosses.





The second employee I would like to introduce is Terry Mayfield. Most of you may remember Terry from when he worked in the Parks Department. Today, you can find Terry working behind the scenes maintaining and caring for all the city buildings with issues from the roof to the dirt. He has worked for Live Oak for the last seven years.

Terry has lived San Antonio for 32 years and married his wife, Debra, 30 years ago. Terry and Debra had three children, Kasey who is a teacher for Great Hearts Live Oak, Cole who was a physicist and worked for a science

Cole passed away in 2019 due to carbon monoxide poisoning so Terry and Debra wanted to establish this fund in his name with the Live Oak Fire Department.

In 2013, Terry started with the city of Live Oak. As part of the parks department, Terry was instrumental in establishing the tree farm behind the parks house as well as contributing to the Disc Golf course and all activities in the park. Terry especially enjoyed collecting seeds as he and Debra traveled around the city and country and nurturing those seeds into trees. Some seeds were from the Heritage trees downtown, New York City Central Park and the arboretum in Dallas.

Starting in 2017, Terry began as the building technician. In this role, he has saved the city \$28,000 through getting rebates for the installation of LED lighting and has overseen \$300,000 in capital improvement projects. Additionally, he monitors all crews providing services to the city buildings.

In the days of Covid, Terry has worked to make sure that all departments have PPE and materials needed for sanitation. He has done an excellent job in keeping all employees and visitors safe.

When not working, Terry loves movies, theater productions and traveling. He also enjoys listening to audio books. He spends much time in their backyard, swimming, tending to his vegetable garden or playing with his two dogs and cat.

If you see Mark, Terry or any of our city employees around town give them a friendly wave. They are working hard for you every day and all year long. 



Happy New Year. SAFE BE SMART AND

The Live Oak Police Department would like to wish you a Happy New Year! It is our goal to create an environment where everyone can feel safe

to live, work and play. One way we do this is through traffic enforcement and impaired driving enforcement.

Impaired drivers create a substantial risk of injury and death to other motorists and pedestrians. The legal limit of intoxication in the State of Texas is a breath or blood alcohol concentration of 0.08%. If a person has that concentration in their body and they are operating a motor vehicle in a public place they are driving while intoxicated.

But understand that any alcohol, drug, even a prescription drug affects a person's ability to safely operate a motor vehicle. Motor skills decline, reaction time declines, and the ability to quickly understand what a person is seeing and to take the necessary precautions or actions declines. If you are out and decide to consume alcohol, have a plan. A designated driver or ride service are your best options to get you home safely. Do not endanger the lives of others because you feel

you are perfectly capable of driving home.

Live Oak Police officers are constantly looking to take dangerous, intoxicated drivers off the road. If an officer stops a driver for a traffic violation and believes that the driver may be intoxicated, the driver will be asked to get out of the vehicle and field sobriety test will be conducted. If the driver fails the field sobriety tests, the driver will be arrested for Driving While Intoxicated. The driver will be asked to submit a sample of breath or blood. If the driver refuses to do so, a search warrant will be obtained requesting a sample of the drivers' blood. Once the sample is secured the driver will be taken before a magistrate for the charge. If the driver refuses, the State of Texas will also automatically suspend the driver's

Be safe, be smart and don't drink and drive. It is a deadly combination and there is no reason for it to happen. Have a plan to get home safely and not place other lives in danger. It is not worth the risk. Remember, the Live Oak Police Department is your community partner. Together, we can make a difference.

According to NFPA statistics, about half of the nation's home structure fires and more than half of the home fire deaths occur in the five-month span between November and March, with January being the peak month.

Cooking and heating are the leaders in contributing to structure fires, however, a third factor we may forget about is Christmas tree fires.

2020's Fire Prevention campaign was "Serve Up Fire Safety in the Kitchen" as cooking is the top cause of winter home fires and cooking is the number one cause of home fires and injuries. Unattended cooking is the leading cause of fires in the kitchen. If you are tired, drowsy, take a break from cooking and order take out.

Heating is also a leading cause of fires, with fire departments responding to an average of 52,000 fires involving heating

equipment each year in 2012-2016 according to NFPA. Dirty chimneys were the most common source of heat-related fires and portable space heaters have caused the most heating-related deaths mainly because something combustible is set too close to the heater. Remember to have your chimney cleaned before the first use of the season and keep combustibles at least three feet away.

The third factor a lot of people tend to forget about is the Christmas tree. Roughly three-quarters of Christmas tree fires occur late in December to mid-January from being left up too long and drying out. Lighting and electrical factors are involved in half of these fires.

We should all remember to change out smoke detectors batteries at least once (1) a year, but how often do we remember to check the Carbon Monoxide detector? Referencing First Alert, if your carbon monoxide alarm has replaceable batteries, they should be changed at least every six (6) months. Carbon Monoxide poisoning is common during the colder months as we use heating appliances. You can also contact the Live Oak Fire Department at (210) 653-9140, extension 2379 and inquire about both smoke alarms and the Kemeth Cole Carbon Monoxide Detector programs. The Live Oak Fire Department family wishes you and yours a Happy New Year!





Home fires occur more in winter than in any other season. As you stay cozy and warm this winter, be fire smart!



Half of all home heating fires occur in December, January and February.



Heating equipment is involved in 1 in every 7 home fires and 1 in every 5 home fire deaths.



Keep anything that can burn at least 3 feet from any heat source like fireplaces, wood stoves, radiators or space



Keep portable generators outside, away from windows, and as far away from your home as possible.



Install and test carbon monoxide alarms at least once a month.



Plug only 1 heat-producing **appliance** (like a space heater) into an electrical outlet at a time



Have a qualified professional clean and inspect your chimney and vents every year.



Store cooled ashes in a tightly covered metal container, and keep it outside at least 10 feet from your home and any nearby

Northeast Lakeview College **Breaks Ground** on New STEM Building

Northeast Lakeview College (NLC) officially broke ground

on its new Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) Building on November 5th with a ground breaking ceremony.

The 86,390 sq. ft. facility will be the college's 10th building and will include classrooms and labs for physics, chemistry, study spaces, academic support, and a 3rd floor multipurpose room with the ability to host large events. The multipurpose room can hold up to 250 occupants and can be divided into three separate rooms. When fully open, the room has a beautiful view south of the Live Oak Lake. Additionally, south facing balconies extend the flexibility of the space. The facility will also provide space so that NLC can expand its career and technical programs in the future.

With students needs' in mind, the building will also provide a study café and sticky spaces for student

collaboration or quiet study and reflection. Each sticky space is equipped with electrical outlets, USB ports and automatic motion sensor lights. Labs and classrooms are equipped with IDEA screens and projectors for engaging and interactive instruction. On the 1st floor, the Flexible Classroom can be divided into two teaching spaces. Student project tables will be equipped with lift-up TV monitors on one end connected to the large projector and screen. Exterior to the building, entry plaza furniture and shade structures bring the collaborative aspect outside.

"This facility will provide additional access to education for students pursuing high-demand, high-wage fields, says Dr. Veronica Garcia, NLC president. Our science courses fill quickly, she added. This new building will allow us to expand course offerings to meet the growing needs of our community." NLC currently serves more than 6,500 students in northeast San Antonio, Bexar, Comal, and Guadalupe Counties.







The architect on the project is Ford, Powell, & Carson and Turner Construction has been selected to complete the build. The \$36M facility is being constructed as part of the Alamo Colleges District bond that was passed in May 2017. Dr. Mike Flores, Alamo Colleges District Chancellor, Dr. Veronica Garcia, NLC President, Will Fanning, Dean for Academic Success (STEM & Career Technical Fields), members of the Alamo Colleges District Board of Trustees, Mayor Mary M. Dennis, Councilmen Ed Cimics and Ramon Norris Jr. were all in attendance for the special occasion. The new STEM facility is expected to be open for classes in the fall of 2022.















Coming Soon to Live Oak Town Center

STORM-WATER **Pollution Solutions**

What is Storm-water Runoff?

Storm-water runoff occurs when precipitation from rain flows over the ground. Impervious surfaces like driveways, sidewalks, and streets prevent stormwater runoff from naturally soaking into the ground.

Why is Storm-water Runoff a Problem?

Storm-water can pick up debris, chemicals, dirt, and other pollutants and flow into a storm sewer system or directly to a lake, stream or river. Anything that enters a storm sewer system is discharged untreated into the water-bodies we use for swimming, fishing and providing drinking water.

What Can I Do to Help?

- Recycle or properly dispose of household products that contain chemicals, such as insecticides, pesticides, paint, solvents, and used motor oil and other auto fluids. Do not pour them onto the ground or into storm drains.
- Do not over-water your lawn. Consider using a soaker hose instead of a sprinkler.
- Compost or mulch yard waste. Do not leave it in the street or sweep it into storm drains or streams.
- Cover piles of dirt or mulch being used in landscaping projects.

Remember, every little bit helps!

Water we save is water we do not have to buy. It is important we do everything we can to decrease our water consumption. Plumbing fixture retrofits, water saver landscapes, and improved habits are all things that will help us make low water use a part of every person's everyday life.

FRIENDLY REMINDER

Just a friendly reminder that for the safety of residents, emergency personnel and businesses, the City does require that house and business address numbers be visible on a structure from the street or road fronting the property. In Section 304.3 of the International Property Maintenance Code states the following requirements for premises identification.

- Numbers must contrast with background they are placed on;
- Numbers must be numerical or spelled out alphabetically;
- Numbers must be a minimum of 4 inches in height and have a stroke width of 0.5 inches; AND
- Numbers must be illuminated with at least 60 Watts of light.

EMS, Fire and Police use these numbers to respond to emergency calls, so it is important that all homes and businesses in our City are properly identified to ensure the quickest response.



Helpful Tips: House numbers with the proper size requirements can be found at most home improvement stores and since house numbers must be illuminated by light, we recommend placing them next to an already existing light source, such as a porch or garage light. From your friendly neighborhood code compliance team, thank you for your help and have a safe New Year.
