
During this year's budget workshops and discussions, Council will continue our work in areas that we believe are among our most critical and that strengthen each of our goals for the City as we prepare for FY 2019/2020. As a Council we must continue to focus on fiscal responsibility and realistic fact based budgeting. We will take action on our set goals and address the changes necessary to give our community a competitive advantage.

I would like to highlight a few of the successes from the past budget year. We are proud to report that the updating process on the City's Comprehensive Plan which regulates our public policies on transportation, utilities, land use, recreation, and housing is underway. A citizen committee was appointed by Council to accomplish a review of each of the chapters in the current plan. Additionally, staff and the Planning & Zoning Commission will continue their yearlong review of city ordinances ensuring that all outdated information is updated.

Also, a thorough evaluation of the city facilities and their needs for repair or upgrades was completed. Each of the

projects were identified and assessed a priority level. Staff will utilize this evaluation and assessment to identify some projects in the 2019/20 budget to improve our city facilities. This evaluation included all city buildings, storage facilities, park amenities, and city signage and entry monuments. Finally, the Fire Department successfully implemented the Residential Knox Box Loaner Program. With this program, emergency responders can gain access to your home when you are unable to open the door during emergency situations. This valuable program will help save lives in Live Oak.

As we begin a new budget process, Council and I are excited to work on the most significant priorities for our wonderful city. We remain committed to continuing this way of working together and working hard to find areas of agreement and to keep delivering results to our residents and businesses. As your Mayor, I am always available for your comments or questions at 210-792-7168. Remember, the best is yet to come!

Protect Yourself with Flood Insurance

A few inches of rain can cause flooding conditions, and water inside a residential structure can easily cause tens of thousands of dollars in damage. Although historically Live Oak has had only a few claims, if you experience any damage caused by water, flood insurance is the only way to protect yourself from devastating losses.

Flood insurance is available to homeowners, condo owners, and commercial owners, and renters. The costs vary depending on how much insurance is purchased, what it covers, and the flood risk to the property. All policies provide

coverage for buildings and their contents, however, you might want to discuss insuring personal property with your agent, since contents coverage is optional. There is typically a 30-day waiting period from date of purchase before your policy goes into effect, so the sooner you act, the better.

If you have any floodplain related questions, or questions about the location of the floodplain in relation to your property, please don't hesitate to contact Scott Wayman at 653-9140 ext. 2261.



Stop the Pop Reminder

The Live Oak Fire Department would like to remind everyone that Live Oak has an Ordinance in effect that



makes fireworks illegal to discharge or even have in your possession within the City limits. The City will continue to enforce compliance with state law and local city ordinance,

in respect to fireworks and fire and safety regulations this July 4th. If a minor is caught with fireworks, the parent or guardian will receive the fine even if they were unaware of the minor's possession and/or usage.

Citizens should report all complaints, regarding the illegal use of fireworks, directly to the LOPD Tel-communicator (non-emergency line) at 210-653-0033. If the citizen believes that there may be a fire and/or medical emergency related to the use of fireworks, he/she should dial 9-1-1 and request the LOFD.



If your home looks uninhabited, you may draw their attention. If you are planning an out of town trip, prepare a plan for your home as well.

Have newspapers or deliveries picked up by a neighbor or friend and also have them empty your mailbox. Valuable information left in your mailbox is an opportunity for theft. credit card abuse and use of your personal information. If you will be gone for an extended period, make arrangements to have your yard maintained.

The appearance of people in the home and daily activity deters would-be thieves and burglars. The use of timers with lighting is an effective method of providing the appearance of an occupied home. Timers are also very useful for televisions and stereos.

If you have more than one vehicle, be sure to leave a vehicle parked in the driveway. If you have someone stopping by to pick up mail and newspapers, ask them to make changes on the interior of your home. Have them open or close curtains or shutters whenever they are there. If you do not have lights on a timer, have them turn on different lights in the house periodically.


Maintenance Can Prevent Your Water Heater Tank from Malfunctioning

A hot shower or a sink full of hot water for dishwashing is a daily necessity for homeowners, and we all want to avoid having a malfunctioning or unreliable hot water heater system. It's essential to take care of your water heater to ensure that you will continue to have hot water now and in the future. In this article, we will share a few water heater warning signs and simple maintenance tips that can be performed to keep your system running smooth and your family safe.

Improper Installation. Improper water heater installation is often due to homeowners' hiring unlicensed plumbers. Allowing inexperienced plumbers to install a water heater incorrectly could cause an explosion and you could be held 100% responsible for any damages caused. Looking for the cheapest price or hiring an unlicensed plumber to install your water heater is a recipe for disaster. Soldering the fittings on top of the water heater is a common installation mistake made by do-it-yourselfers and unlicensed plumbers. If heat is applied directly to the top of the appliance you could melt the dip tube or other plastic parts and cause serious damage to the water heater.

Failed Pressure Relief Valve. If water is dripping from the pressure relief valve pipe, it typically means that the system is working properly to release overly hot water and reduce pressure in the system. However, if water drips often and regularly, it is a sign of a problem. This means that the water heater is

frequently overheating the water. You should adjust the thermostat down so that there is not as much pressure in the tank. If the temperature is set too high and pressure builds up faster than the pressure release



valve can handle, it could cause your water heater to explode. Make sure your heater is set in the safe temperature range. The temperature and pressure relief valve is a safety valve that kicks open if the water reaches 210 degrees Fahrenheit or the pressure inside the tank exceeds 50 lbs. PSI.

Routine Maintenance. Routine maintenance is key

It has been said that good fences make good neighbors. I'm not sure that this is always the case. I've had some pretty good neighbors with whom I shared



no fence at all. I have also had some neighbors for which the Great Wall of China would not have sufficed. In fact, I'm pretty sure that the quality of one's fence has absolutely no bearing whatsoever on the quality of one's neighbor. The quality and appearance of one's fence does, however, have a significant effect on the quality and appearance of the neighborhood.

Fences are one of the most visible parts of our neighborhoods. If you've ever built a new fence or replaced an old one you've probably stood back, looked at that wonderful wall of new wood and wondered why you didn't do it earlier.

Here is the code and related definitions regarding fences within Live Oak. 302.7 Accessory structures. All accessory structures, including detached garages, fences and walls, shall be maintained structurally sound and in good repair.

STRUCTURE That which is built or constructed or a portion thereof.

STRUCTURE FAILURE means the inability of a structure or structural member to perform its intended function. perhaps caused by collapse or excessive deformation.

That's pretty dry stuff. What does it mean? Essentially, we are expected to keep our fences in a way that allows them to perform their intended job of being a fence. If your privacy fence no longer affords you any privacy it's not doing its job. If your fence is leaning over; you need to stand it back up. If your privacy fence has holes and splits which weakens its integrity in some places, it's time to replace some pickets. Good fences may or may not make good neighbors, but good neighbors maintain good fences. Be a good neighbor.



Animal Control officers have been busy responding to snake calls within the residential neighborhoods lately. One snake was located by officers in the rafters of a back patio and they expect snake sightings will continue during the summer. So we

would like to issue a warning to you to be on the watch for rattlesnakes and other snakes that are active at this time of year. We encourage you to be aware of your surroundings and learn to recognize the different snake species that are likely to be in the area.

Garter Snake: These guys are relatively small but can range between 23 and 30 inches and sometimes even up to 5 ft. Garter snakes can take up residence anywhere; woodlands, grassy knolls, and love to be near water. These fast moving, highly terrestrial creatures may like to climb into shrubs or vines and are excellent swimmer. They will give off a bad musky smell to ward off their predators. Although a non-venomous snake, their bite can cause swelling or itching, and anyone bitten should clean the bite thoroughly.

Rat Snake: The most commonly found rat snakes can grow up to 6ft long and coloration varies based on location.



In Eastern Texas they are grayer while some in Central Texas are yellower, but all Texas rat snakes have reddish orange skin beneath their scales with splotchy patterns. It's known to be shy but snappish and aggressive when cornered. The rat snake may vibrate its tail in attempt to trick predators into thinking they are rattlesnakes. They take shelter in trees waiting for prey and are great swimmers.

Rattlesnake: Texas is home to 8 different types of rattlesnakes. You may see more of the Western Diamondback in our area. The head is triangular shaped and have dark diamondshaped patterns along its back. Western Diamondbacks commonly grow around 4ft in length but are said to be one of the biggest snakes in Texas stretching up to 7.5ft not including their rattle. The rattle is made up of protein called "keratin," the same protein that forms fingernails. It's one of the most venomous snakes and the venom can quickly destroy tissues of the body's blood vessels, blood cells and heart. Bites should be treated immediately.

It will be a hotttt summer and these guys love cool spots and areas with water. Please be careful and do not hesitate to contact Live Oak animal control for assistance. We want everyone to have a safe summer.

Let's Talk Trash

We hope that residents do whatever they can to make the city in which we live as beautiful as possible. Trash collection service is provided by the city through a contract with Waste Management, (WM) a national company focusing on the handling and recycling of waste. We would like to share a couple things about the city's typical trash pickup service that you may not know. The weight of the waste containers is important to protect the handlers from injury. Waste Management will pick up your individual trash bags below 35 pounds or a trash container below 60 pounds. They will also pick up brush if bundled and tied securely to a size comparable to a normal trash can.

To keep our neighborhoods from looking unsightly, please avoid having your trash placed at the curb any earlier than the night before pick up and remove receptacles as soon as possible following pick up. Please make an effort to store your trash cans in a neat and orderly fashion preferably out of public view.

WM provides two sizes of waste wheeler carts for trash as well as recycling. The use of WM's containers is optional

and available for a small monthly fee. If you choose to use your own trash can, we recommend that you place markings on it to identify your address. In the event that your WM waste wheeler cart disappears, (unfortunately it does happen) we ask that you call the police to report the theft. They will provide you with a case number that you will need to request a replacement.

We receive a lot of calls from residents unsure about whether or not certain items are recyclable. Contamination and unsuitable recyclable materials in the recycling stream is a huge problem for the processing plant. The cost we pay for recycling will go up if we do not reduce contamination. Please help us maintain a clean recycling stream of clean paper, plastics, and metal cans by reviewing the list of recyclables below. For additional questions, WM provides a website to answer specific questions about recycling. Please see https://www.wm.com/recycling-services/home. jsp for more information.

DO NOT BAG RECYCLABLES

RECYCLE OFTEN:



Paper: Most types of paper, such as ad circulars, catalogs, carbonless paper, envelopes, file folders, flattened cardboard, junk mail, magazines, newspapers, office paper, paper towel/ toilet paper core, phone books, paperback books, paper bags, non-metallic gift wrap.

Plastics: Labeled #1 through #7. Look for the recycling symbol on the bottom. Remove lids and rinse.Examples: beverage bottle, shampoo and lotion bottles, meat trays, condiment bottles, prescription medicine bottles, and plastic grocery bags (tied together into bundle).

Metal Cans: Aluminum, steel and tin beverage and food cans (rinse all food or liquids), aerosol cans, (empty and remove nozzle), baking tins, (rinse and remove remaining food).

RECYCLE RIGHT:

Things you can do to ensure quaility material is recycled:

DO NOT INCLUDE: Food waste, plastic bags, or polystyrene foam cups & containers.



Contact Waste Management Customer Service at 800-800-5804 for a recycle bin or for missed pick up of garbage, brush, or recyclables. Any additional containers may be used and must be clearly marked recycling.
