Dear Residents,


Budget talks and reviews are currently underway between staff and City Council. Budgets, like cities, are living things that can adjust to new information and ideas each year. In the current 2017/18 budget, the General Fund's number one source of revenue is taxes at 73%. But the main source of taxes is not property taxes. The main source of taxes for the city is sales tax. The City is very blessed to have a great commercial business mix within its community. The sales tax generated from these businesses account for the largest revenue stream for the City's General Fund. Of the 8.25% sales tax paid at the registers, 6.25% goes to the State, 1% comes to the General Fund, 0.5% comes to the General Fund to provide property tax relief and the last 0.5% goes to the Live Oak Economic Development Corporation.

We hope that you will join us during these public proceedings to get a better understanding of the budget process and a look at the presentations from each city department. The dates and times of the budget meetings will be listed on the city's website.

With school about to start, neighborhood sidewalks and streets will be flooded with families excited about the new school year. We ask that you please be patient and cautious while driving around or near school buses and crosswalks at both Ed Franz and Crestview Elementary schools. The safety of our residents, as always, is a priority. I welcome back the principals, teachers, students and faculty for a safe and successful, fun school year. Live Oak has so much to be proud of, and to build on for bright futures of our children.

Finally, mark your calendars for the upcoming "Shin Dig on Shin Oak" on September 15th. Shin Dig will have local food vendors, midway games, carnival rides, activities for the kids in the Kid Zone followed by a concert featuring the "Spazmatics". 



Memorial Day Parade






Leos Runs BOSTON MARATHON for a Cause

Longtime resident, Fernando Leos recently checked one of his "bucket list" items off the list by running the prestigious 2018 122nd Boston Marathon! This year's marathon was a rainy and cold day but nothing stopped Leos from the day's event including his biggest support system, his wife, Paula and their daughter which also resides in the Boston area. You may have seen Leos running through the neighborhoods of Live Oak for either a leisure run or for a local competition but the serious training began a few years ago after qualifying for the marathon. Leos was given the opportunity to run as a race ambassador for Team "Wake-Up Narcolepsy" (WUN) and raised \$10,516.00 for the cause. Throughout Leos' life, running was a huge part of his daily routine. His love of running began in middle school, continued during his 24 year military career and now into his retirement in 1994. At 67 years young, Leos can be found sporting his signature red, white and blue tank and running shorts at 5K and 10K events around Live Oak and the surrounding area. Before the Boston Marathon, he completed the Randolph AFB Half Marathon in less than two hours.

Mr. Leos chose to represent WUN because of his own sleeping disorder battle. "I feel that Narcolepsy is a true disability and the money raised for research is very important" Leos said. "Narcolepsy affects an estimated 1 in 2,000 people in the U.S." Representing WUN and running the race was an honor while also helping in the research for such a great cause. During the last 1.2 miles of the marathon, Leos dedicated his run in memory of his niece, Christina Kaup. The City proudly sponsored Mr. Leos during his once-in-a- lifetime endeavor and look forward to seeing him and his wife daily while running or biking as they utilize City Hall for their traditional pit stop for water. Congratulations Mr. Leos! Keep on running!

How Secure Is Your Home?



Home Security Survey


The Live Oak Police Department recently sent three officers to a Texas Crime Prevention Course. All three successfully completed the course and can perform a home security survey at your residence. A home security survey is beneficial for several reasons. First of all, the LOPD offers this service at no charge, homeowners have the peace of mind that they have properly secured their home and most insurance companies offer a discount on premiums for people who have taken the necessary steps and successfully complete the requirements. Simply call the department to schedule a survey - day, evening and weekend hours are available. An officer who is certified to perform the crime prevention inspection will arrive and inspect your home. The officer will be looking at deadbolt locks, strike plates, windows, secondary locking devices and lighting. Many homes already comply with the set standards. If your home does not, the officer will recommend the necessary changes and upgrades that are required. You may be surprised that if changes are required, they can be easily completed by the homeowner at minimal cost. Once you have completed this, the officer will return to re-inspect your home. Once the survey is complete the officer will provide the homeowner with documentation to provide to the insurance company allowing a price deduction.

The department has offered this service to our citizens for years, but with the additional officers now certified in this program, we have become more flexible with the days and hours to perform this service. Remember safety and security is a strong partnership between the police and the community. Help us keep Live Oak a safe place to work, live and play.

What you need to know about 911

idyouknowthatLiveOakE-911Communications Center now has Text-to-911 services available? Live Oak residents now have the ability to text an emergency to 911 call takers from a mobile phone or device as an alternative to placing a phone call. To use the system, simply address the message to 911 and enter the emergency in the body of the text, making sure to include your exact location and nature of your emergency


because the call takers are unable to see the location when using the text system. Dispatchers need as much information possible to send help your way. If you're in an area that doesn't support the textto-911 system, you will receive a "bounce-back" We text. stress, however, that the Textto-911 System does not replace regular 911 calls but should be thought of only as a last resort, in the event that you can't speak. People who are hard of hearing,



deaf, or speech-impaired should always use TTY for calling when possible. 911 operators are always ready to receive your emergency calls 24-7. Live Oak dispatches emergency calls for the city of Selma Fire, EMS and Police, Judson ISD Police and Live Oak's emergency services and have an average of 18,580 911 calls a year. In 2017, dispatchers received 16,136 calls with 2,444 calls being prank calls or hang-ups. If someone dials 911 by accident, first reaction usually is to hang up. We have all accidentally dialed 911 because of our phones being in a pocket, purse or a child playing with an unlocked activated or with a deactivated cell phone. If a deactivated cell phone has a charge, children will still be able to connect with the 911 emergency system. you accidently call 911,



please do not hang up! When the Dispatcher answers, let them know you have misdialed and be prepared to confirm your phone number and location. It's a policy



to callback every 911 "hang-up" received to ensure the callers safety. By staying on the line, it saves us precious time calling your number back, whether at your home, a business, a hotel, or a cell phone.
