## BENEFITS OF DEVELOPMENT




In the January/February edition of the Hometown News, we reported on the importance of Sales Taxes to the City of Live Oak and its citizens. To refresh your memory, Sales Taxes are the number one revenue stream for the city's General Fund that maintains the performance of all of our core functions.

With the Live Oak Town center on the horizon, in this issue, we would like to take you on a brief trip down memory lane and remind you of some of the milestones and progress the city has made with its developments and its corresponding sales tax success.

Before the Forum Shopping Center becoming established, the city's annual sales tax remittance was in the neighborhood of approximately \$814,000. In the 1990's, prior to the 1.2 million square foot Forum Shopping center, annually the city would see only approximately \$400,000 in Sales taxes. With the development of the Live Oak Crossing in 2004, our sales tax numbers continued to rise and when the Forum Crossing was opened with its corresponding businesses in 2007, sales taxes continued to rise.

So, what has the city done with the revenue over the years? Most importantly, we have continued to contribute to the general fund



and buy down the property taxes that are paid by every citizen and business owner. In addition, we have contributed to the best parks in the Randolph Metrocom, with a fishing lake, disc golf fields, Skate Spot, ball fields, walking and nature trails and many of the finest amenities that parks have to offer. We have also been able to assist many of our existing business owners improve building facades and enhance their signage to businesses with our Visual Improvement incentive package. These grant monies are geared to ensure the buildings stay current and appealing. Our Sales taxes also contribute to the production of this magazine which has turned into the number one way in which some residents get their information and keep up with what goes on within the city.

With the excitement the Live Oak Town Center will bring, and a new list of restaurants and businesses we will all be able to patronize, our future is bright. The benefits of our expanding commercial base will serve our city, our services, and most importantly our residents well, for many years to come.



#### REDUCE STORM WATER POLLUTION

#### **Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination**

The City's Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) permit requires the City to implement an illicit discharge program. The purpose of this program is to identify and eliminate any individual non-storm water discharge that is contributing a significant amount of pollutants to the City and state waters.

#### What is an Illicit Discharge?

An illicit discharge is the intentional or unintentional release of non-storm water materials that may enter the City's storm drain system, streams or ponds by dumping, pouring, throwing, spilling or abandoning. Some discharges are not considered illicit because they are authorized by the City's MS4 permit.

#### Example of Illicit Discharges

- Improper disposal of vehicle fluids and toxic wastes such as motor oil and household hazardous wastes.
- Fats, oils and grease from food service establishments.
- Chlorinated swimming pool water.
- Inappropriate disposal of grass clippings and leaves.
- Sewage and septic tank effluent.

#### WATER BILLING CHANGE NOTICE!

Beginning April 1, 2017 the City of Live Oak Water Department will no longer hang "Final Past Due" Notices on doors prior to water shut off. The "Late Letter" sent via mail/email will serve as final notice. If you have any questions or need assistance with your water bill please call 210-653-9140.



That's why it's so important to test them monthly and make sure they're working properly. Smoke alarms with non-replaceable (long-life) batteries are designed to remain effective for up to 10 years. If the alarm chirps, warning that the battery is low, replace the entire smoke alarm right away. For smoke alarms that don't have non-replaceable (long-life) batteries, replace the batteries at least once a year. If the alarm chirps, replace only the battery.

The National Fire Protection Association reports that 71% of smoke alarms which failed to operate had missing, disconnected or dead batteries. This reinforces how important it is to take this time each year to check smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. The Live Oak Fire Department is supporting the National Fire Protection Association to actively reminding everyone to change their smoke alarm batteries when they change their clocks for daylight saving time this Sunday, March 12, 2017.



Daylight Saving Time is a great time to remember to change your smoke alarm batteries after you set your clocks ahead. This small step is an easy one, but it can help save lives.



DON'T BLOW IT into the Street! There's nothing like the smell of freshly cut grass on a sunny morning when it's nice and cool outside. You look at your yard and nod your head knowing those "Code Compliance" guys won't be bothering you about high grass this week! You sweep your driveway and sidewalk to get rid of the clippings, but some of it is in the street. The wind will blow it away, you say to yourself, as you get ready to take a drink of your lemonade, only to see the dreaded Code Compliance guy pull up to your house. What does he want now?





We know you can't control the wind, so perhaps the leaves came from down the street and just happened to settle in front of your house. In those cases, we rely on our street sweeping crew to pick up the yard waste against the curbs and in the street. Why do we have a street sweeper if I have to sweep the road too you might ask. Unfortunately, the street sweeper cannot possibly clean every road every day, so this is where you come in to "save the day" and help keep our streets, drainage and storm drains free of yard waste and debris. #### **Simple Ways to Save Gas Money** & Help Reduce Air Pollution

Alamo Area Council With averages hovering just below \$2.00 per gallon, gasoline prices in the Alamo area are relatively lower than in recent memory. Still, when the generosity and celebration of the holiday

season is leaving many a payment card drained, even these prices can be taxing. Practicing some simple ways to save money by making a gallon of gas go farther can be helpful. The Alamo Area Council of Governments' (AACOG's) Commute Solutions program suggests these easy, gas-saving tips:

- Combine errands into one trip. Several single, short trips taken with a cold engine can use twice as much fuel as one trip covering the same distance when the engine is warm.
- Share the ride. When you ride with just one other person who lives nearby, half the amount of gas otherwise used is saved. Between the two of you, that's like saving \$.99 on a gallon of gas that costs \$1.98. You may find a carpool partner at www.Nuride.com.
- Walk or bike for trips of a mile or less. According to a Nationwide Personal Transportation Survey, 25 percent of all trips are made within a mile of one's home. Why not walk or ride a bike while the weather's cooler? It costs nothing and is great exercise.
- Drive the speed limit or less. Gas mileage usually decreases rapidly at speeds above 50 miles per hour (mph). If you drive steadily at 75 rather than 65 mph, you'll use about 14% more gasoline per gallon, depending on your engine size—and that's about 27 cents worth!
- Avoid traffic congestion. You're burning fuel but going nowhere when your vehicle is stopped in heavy traffic, wasting 1 to 2 cents in gas every minute. When possible, don't drive during peak rush hours and avoid heavy traffic areas caused by construction or special events.
- Ride the bus to special events. VIA operates bus service to many San Antonio special events from their park & ride lots. A roundtrip costs \$5.00, but you'll save more than that in parking fees, gasoline, and wear and tear—on your nerves as well as your car! Visit www.viainfo.net for more information.
- Ease up on the gas and brake pedals. Speeding, rapid acceleration, and excessive braking can lower gas mileage by 33 percent at highway speeds and by 5 percent at lower speeds. On average, aggressive drivers waste 65 cents per gallon on the highway and 10 cents per gallon on city streets.
- Park and go inside. Idling a vehicle's engine for more than 10 seconds in drive-through lanes at restaurants, banks, and pharmacies uses more gas than turning off your engine and re-starting it. Idling can use a fourth to a half gallon of fuel per hour, depending on engine size and air conditioner (AC) use. Just 5 minutes of idling in a drive-through lane wastes 5 to 10 cents in fuel.
- Keep the junk out of your trunk. An extra 100 pounds in your vehicle reduces fuel economy by 1 to 2 percent or 2 to 4 cents per gallon. (Smaller cars are affected more by excess weight.)
- Don't load your car rack. If you must use your vehicle to haul items, it's better to put them inside than on a roof rack. Due to aerodynamic drag, a loaded roof rack can decrease your fuel economy by 10-25 percent on the expressway, and cost you between 20 and 50 cents more per gallon.

#### **Public Service Announcement from Cibolo Creek Municipal Authority**

You may have read in the news that "flushable" wipes put into the sewer system cause many problems. Instead of dissolving like toilet paper, these wipes clump together with grease, forming long mop-like clumps that clog

sewer pipes and damage equipment. This leads to more costly maintenance to clear the lines and which cost is ultimately passed along to the consumer. Only three things are truly flushable: human waste, toilet paper and water. Another problem that affects the sewer system comes from fats, oils and grease. This includes food scraps, cooking oil, shortening, lard, butter, gravy, mayonnaise and sour cream. These items when poured down the kitchen drains, accumulates inside sewer pipes. As this builds up, it restricts the flow in the pipe and can cause untreated wastewater to back up into homes and businesses. Manholes can overflow into parks, yards, streets, and storm drains. This leads to contamination of local waters, including drinking water. Communities spend billions of dollars every year unplugging or replacing grease blocked pipes, repairing pump stations and cleaning up costly wastewater spills. Keeping these types of greases out of the sewer system helps everyone in the community. More information may be found at: www.ccmatx.org




