Live Oak Fire Chief retiring after 34 years "It's time to put my family first"



One of the first things Charles Foster says about his 34 years as a member of the Live Oak's Fire Department is how fast time has gone by. "Time flies. It has been a good, long ride," Foster said. Foster will turn 55 in a few months. He was promoted to chief in 2006. Before

that, he was the Assistant Chief for 17 years, but he said now is the time to hang up his gear. "I am to the point in my life where I want to start taking it easy....it's time to put my family first," Foster said. Chief Foster said his replacement will face a few challenges. He said one of the biggest is the need for more personnel in a growing city.

"Years ago, when I first started, we had enough people probably to stomp out the fire when we responded to a call," Foster said. "Today, it's a lot different. The city population has grown fast and structures have quadrupled. Growth is good and we are very grateful for the mutual aid we've received from our neighboring cities over the years. We have a talented group of firefighters, but averaging 1700 calls a year can be daunting. Every department needs to grow and that is always a challenge that the Fire Chief faces. The safety of our citizens and visitors is paramount."

Chief Foster looks back on the highs and lows of his career. He said one of the best parts was keeping up with the advancements in firefighting technology. Starting the fire service as a cadet at age 13, he has watched these changes evolve over 42 years. "We used to have cotton duck protective clothing, now we have state of the art fire



resistant gear. "I can remember receiving the call to aid the county out at Bulverde Road. I hopped on the back of a 1953 Diamond Reo 6x6 converted military vehicle and hung on as we flew down Loop 1604. Our current Safety Policy won't allow that now," Foster said with a laugh. "As I walk out into the fire bays, I can now see much more modern fire apparatus. It is just amazing."

His low points were calls where lives were lost. He said one of the worst was a structure fire which resulted in the city's only fire fatality. "All deaths are hard to deal with, that's the worst part of the job," Foster said. His appreciation for the new talent that enters the fire department is unwavering. "These firefighters are eager and motivated to learn as much as possible to be great at their jobs. I am so proud of them all. The brothers and sisters of our profession are very close. Everyone disagrees from time to time, but the loyalty and constant friendships are steadfast. I will miss that day to day interaction."



Scott Wayman, City Manager, says "Chief Foster will be greatly missed. He was the cohesive factor holding the department together for many years. His

leadership has been extremely valuable and I wish him well in his next endeavor."



As his time as chief winds down, Chief Foster looks forward to the new adventures that await him in retirement. "It has been an honor and a real privilege to serve the city of Live Oak for all these years. I hope I can get used to taking it easy in retirement," Foster said.

Chief Foster officially retired on February 28, 2018. City

Administration wish Chief Foster well and now look forward to welcoming the new Fire Chief.





ith normal everyday use of any hot water heater it eventually will need to be replaced. Our department inspects new installations of hot water heaters every week. We have had a few instances where a new hot water heater had been placed in an attic. The city of Live Oak does not allow hot water heaters to be placed in attics per the amended Plumbing Code.



2015 International Plumbing Code Amended Section 502 - Water Heaters shall be prohibited from being installed in R1 and R2 attic space. If installed on second story and above

(excluding attic space) extra support must be placed to support weight of 2 (two) filled water heaters of the same size.

There are a few homes left in Live Oak that had their hot water heaters originally installed in the attic. When these hot water heaters are replaced they must be removed from the attic space according to the 2015 International Plumbing Code Amended Section 502 in which the city of Live Oak adopted January 27, 2015.

Disadvantages to having your water heater in your attic may be obvious to most but some disadvantages may have never crossed your mind. A few of the major problems in having a water heater in the attic are:

- Leaks can cause major damage
- Maintenance of the unit and adjusting the temperature is more difficult in the attic
- Replacement of an attic unit can be more costly

We recommend consulting with a certified plumber before attempting to relocate an attic water heater or dealing with any plumbing issues in your home. by reducing that concern, the Alamo Area Council of Governments' Certified Auto Ride in an Emergency (CARE) Program offers those who've commuted by alternative means a reimbursement of up to \$50 for a ride home from work when an emergency arises.

To receive a reimbursement up to four times per year, you must: 1) live and work within the eight-county greater San Antonio area; 2) carpool /vanpool, take the bus, bike, or walk to work at least three times per week; and 3) keep your commuting information current on NuRide.com, the online system AACOG uses to gather commuting statistics. While it's free for individuals to use, NuRide offers not only CARE Program reimbursements, but rewards from more than 100 businesses.

Minutes can mean the difference in a life-threatening situation, every minute is critical. In an effort to serve you better, the Fire and Police Departments is requesting that residents cooperate in posting their street numbers on their homes visible from the street. If the street numbers on the home are not illuminated by a porch or garage light, please have the numbers painted on the curb near your driveway entrance with a reflective paint. Take a moment to look at your house from the street in front of your home at night. Make sure your house numbers can be easily seen. If they can be, then we have a greater chance of possibly saving a life. The main concern of everyone is for the safety of the residents of Live Oak.

Free Smoke Detectors!


