

Severe Weather Season

In regards to severe weather the months of March, April, and May tend to be our annual severe weather season. The outlook for the next few months' calls for temperatures to be slightly above normal with precipitation chances to be near normal which is a good sign.

Fortunately, we do not have any low water crossings in the City however always remember the slogan "Turn Around –

Don't Drown." Another good slogan to remember regarding thunderstorms is "When Thunder Roars – Go Indoors."

SKYWARN® Training Class

In conjunction with severe weather season the Office of Emergency Management will be hosting a SKYWARN® training class on Wednesday evening, March 19th, 2014, from 6:30 – 8:30 PM. It will be held in the training room at the Live Oak Fire Station.

The class will be conducted by a representative from the Austin/San Antonio Office of the National Weather Service office in New Braunfels. This class is

open to the public and there is no cost involved. Attendance at a SKYWARN® class will enhance your awareness level in identifying potential severe weather conditions that could save your life.

WHAT IS SKYWARN®?

The effects of severe weather are felt every year by many Americans. To obtain critical weather information, NOAA's National Weather Service (NWS), part of the U.S. Department of Commerce, established SKYWARN® with partner organizations. SKYWARN® is a volunteer program with nearly 290,000 trained severe weather spotters. These volunteers help keep their local communities safe by providing timely and accurate reports of severe weather to the National Weather Service.

Although SKYWARN® spotters provide essential information for all types of weather hazards, the main responsibility of a SKYWARN® spotter is to identify and describe severe local storms. In the average year, 10,000 severe thunderstorms, 5,000 floods and more than 1,000 tornadoes occur across the United States. These events threatened lives and property.

Let's Cook, Live Oak!

Here are some light and delicious spring time recipes to enjoy any day of the week!

Vietnamese Cold Spring Rolls (Goi Cuon)

- 1 pkg. clear rice paper wrappers
- 1 cucumber, peeled/cut into very thin strips
- 1 pound cooked, cleaned shrimp (halved)
- 1 cup fresh bean sprouts (optional)
- 1 bunch cilantro leaves (chopped)
- 1 pkg. vermicelli noodles, prepared
- 1 bunch fresh basil (chopped)
- 1 Head leafy head leafy lettuce
- 1 pint strawberries, hulled and sliced

Spinach Salad

6 cups baby spinach

4 oz. crumbled gorgonzola

1/4 cup sliced almonds (toasted) 1-2 avocados, diced half of small red onion. thinly sliced

or blue cheese

Avocado Strawberry

Toss all ingredients together with dressing of choice. Poppy seed dressing is recommended.

- 1 bunch fresh mint (chopped)

Dipping Sauce: 4 tsp. fish sauce, ½ cup water, 2 Tbls. lime juice, 1 clove minced garlic, 2 Tbls. sugar, ½ tsp. chili sauce

Dip a sheet of rice paper in bowl of water for a second or two and lay on flat surface. On one edge place a small handful of noodles, two pieces of shrimp, herbs, bean sprouts and cucumber strip. Carefully start to roll up, tucking in sides, then continue to roll up (not too tight or it will split).

Sauce: mix fish sauce, water, lime juice, garlic, sugar and chili sauce. Hoisin sauce mixed with chopped peanuts may also be used as dipping sauce.
