





Our city must continue to prioritize the safety of our residents. This includes maintaining and upgrading public safety and infrastructure (roads, drainage channels, and





A Trusted Voice Caring for Live Oak

Council Member Dr. Erin Pérez, Place 3

Councilwoman Dr. Erin Pérez represents Place 3. She understands the unique challenges and strengths of our community. Known for her teamcentered collaborative approach and commitment to integrity, due diligence, and transparent governance, she is highly engaged with constituents, actively listening to their needs and concerns. With a background in policy and healthcare for over 20 years, the welfare of our residents is a priority at the local, state, and federal level in strategic planning for today and generations to come.

Councilwoman Pérez is dedicated to creating evidenced based policies that reflect the diverse voices of Live Oak and fostering an inclusive, forward-looking vision where all residents can have the highest quality of life and wellbeing while maintaining modernization, innovation, and sustainability.

Dr. Erin Pérez was first elected to Live Oak City Council Place 3 in May 2021. Dr. Pérez is a 12th generation Texan, descendant of one of the founding Canary Islander families of San Antonio and descendant of an Alamo defender and nurse. She is a public servant, clinician, author, and educator. She and her family have been residents of Live Oak, Texas since 2009. She is active in supporting her family and community in her parish, education, FFA, equine, music, veterans, and law enforcement organizations.

Dr. Pérez is a proud three-time alumna of the University of Texas Medical Branch (UTMB) in Galveston. She practices as a board-certified adult and geriatric nurse practitioner who is also board-certified as a subspecialist in palliative and hospice care. She is recognized as an expert and pioneer in Supportive Palliative Care. She serves Texans as a noted team-builder, effective advocate and bill drafter across the settings and roles. She is active across multiple state, national and international nursing, health care and policy organizations. She is Chair for the Texas Palliative Care Interdisciplinary Advisory Council. Currently, she leads Team Texas as one of six states selected by the National State Academy of State Health Policy (NASHP) supported by the John A. Hartford Foundation for their new national Serious

Illness Institute two-year project which was selected for extension in the spring of 2025. She was elected as President of the Texas Nurse Practitioners and leads over 50,000 nurse practitioners across Texas to name a few of her volunteer endeavors.

In her first term, Dr. Pérez has served as an appointee to the Texas Municipal League (TML) Legislative Summit and involved with the Texas Association of Hispanic Municipal Officials (AHMO). Live Oak is an active partner in the National League of Cities (NLC). Dr. Perez serves in the NLC, Women in Municipal Government (WIMG) and the Hispanic Elected Officials (HELO).

Dr. Pérez looks forward to the future with the deepest gratitude and appreciation for the Live Oak community's support. She is honored and blessed to continue her efforts in public service to improve the health and quality of life for her premier community of Live Oak and great state of Texas where the community lives, learns, works, and plays.

Q1 - If possible, what advice would you give your younger self?

Enjoy the journey. Take time to enjoy all the life experiences in good and challenging times. Even challenges serve a purpose and will be used for good. Remember there is no obstacle, challenge, or barrier that together, you and your team will and cannot overcome. God has a plan and purpose in his perfect timing for each season of your life. The prayers of today are part of his perfect plan for not only your future but those you serve. Life is too short, "Be who God meant you to be, and you will set the world on fire." - Saint Catherine of Sienna. I can reflect on the experiences of my life now and see how God's perfect timing was perfect despite my desire and concerns in that moment. All those experiences have better prepared and equipped me to serve our home in a more comprehensive skill set. I look forward to learning more in efforts to better help our residents live the best quality of life our city can provide.

Q2 - What led you to run for City Council, and how long have you served?

I have been blessed and honored to serve for two terms now. I had various community members approach me to consider serving and I prayed on it for several years. During the pandemic and severe snow and ice storm, I felt called to serve despite the chaos and uncertainties of the world. I knew

this would be a challenge but felt confident God's timing is perfect and in obedience I ran for office having faith he would provide a way. I spent four months essentially away from my family during the early time in the pandemic. Prayers kept me on track and focused on caring for the masses, pivoting quickly and make strategic plans based on fast paced data and evidence that seemed to change throughout any given day. Our sunrises in Live Oak are absolutely breath taking and kept me in the moment of gratitude to wake up each day and serve better than the day before. I felt truly called to serve in this capacity to better help in a broader breadth and depth with my health care and policy backgrounds. I wanted to help save and care for my hometown. I am humbled and so honored to be trusted with the lives of our community. It has been one of the greatest blessings of my lifetime to serve in Place 3 and see the continued evolution of Live Oak into the next chapters.

Q3 - Tell us about your hobbies or what you do in your spare time.

Really my hobbies are all working together in service for our home. As a wife, mother, caregiver, and advocate, I am able to coordinate and network with multiple hobbies. Our family is honored to serve our Veterans of Live Oak and of South Central Texas with Honor Flight San Antonio in addition to activities to support our Police officers. We have an incredible parish with an amazing priest and deacons who have so many opportunities for our family to join and give back to those in need. G.W. is my 17.1 hand Tennessee Walking horse who we board close by. Equestrian, livestock, and animal activities are near and dear to our hearts. We welcomed Miss Tinkerbell Marie to our family last year as a rescue Frenchie. She loves our parks and city. You will likely see us out and about! The music and health care organizations are improving so many lives, and I am grateful to be able to serve when and where they need me across the states. In the warmer days, I tend to my butterfly garden, welcome our hummers and birds while hoping the squirrels do not get all their food. Squirrels are so smart! Anytime we can soak up some sun, enjoy the parks or be able to give back to the community we are grateful for those precious moments. We are so blessed to live, learn, work, and play in Live Oak!

Q4 - What advice would you give someone wanting to get involved in local government?

Live Oak is a small hometown with a heart as big as Texas. We have a plethora of opportunities to get started and to start giving back. From the arts, parks, garden club, humane society, L.O.C.A.P., S.O.L.O., multiple schools or to our many City boards and commissions, there is so much to do and always room at the table to join us on so many layers of civic engagement. Each policy initiative and each project are time intensive with due diligence and labor of love for Live Oak and our region. Together we are able to make so





Time Capsule to Be Opened in 2060





Consult a Veterinarian



Live Oak Fire Department Elevates Rescue Capabilities with Elite Rope Training

A Commitment to Excellence in Technical Rescue

The Live Oak Fire Department (LOFD) continues to set the standard for technical rescue preparedness, recently completing an intensive rope rescue training program in collaboration with Texas Rescue and nationally recognized rope rescue instructor Andy Lancaster. This rigorous 40-hour course provided nine LOFD personnel with operations-level certification, further strengthening the department's response capabilities for complex rescue incidents.


The training was designed to enhance the department's readiness for high-angle rescues, confined space operations, and other specialized incidents requiring advanced rope techniques. Under the expert guidance of Lancaster, whose reputation as a premier instructor in the field is well known across the country, LOFD firefighters honed critical skills in mechanical advantage systems, patient packaging, and high-risk scenarios that demand precise execution and teamwork. "This training ensures that our firefighters are equipped with the knowledge and hands-on experience necessary to manage challenging rescue situations safely and effectively," said Assistant Chief Drewry. "It's about making sure that when the call comes in, our team has the confidence and ability to execute a successful rescue under pressure."

The department's ongoing commitment to technical rescue proficiency is part of a broader initiative to ensure every shift always has at least three fully technician-qualified firefighters available. The recent additions to the operations-level team will work alongside existing rope rescue technicians, bolstering LOFD's ability to respond rapidly and efficiently to emergency situations where specialized skills are required.

By prioritizing continuous training and leveraging expertise from industry leaders like Andy Lancaster, LOFD is reinforcing its commitment to public safety and professional excellence. As the community continues to grow, the fire department remains steadfast in its mission to provide top-tier emergency response services, and ensure the highest level of preparedness for any challenge that may arise.

TXDOT-I-35 Northeast Expansion Construction News Even Concrete Needs a Blanket When It's Cold or Hot The bridge structures you see in the I-35 NEX construction corridor are strong, resilient giants, but it takes a little tender loving care to get them there. That's why the contractor working for TxDOT wrapped the freshly poured cap in this picture in orange insulating fabric.

Industrial blankets help large concrete structures cure correctly and achieve the desired strength, durability, and longevity by maintaining consistent temperature and moisture while the concrete dries.

In the winter, blankets protect against cold, which can slow curing and prevent concrete from reaching its full strength. In the summer, blankets protect against heat and help retain moisture loss, which also can prevent concrete from curing properly.

In conclusion, concrete curing blankets regulate temperature and moisture loss, helping freshly poured concrete cure to full strength.

I-35 NEX Central Progress Report






