


American Red Cross








### **Celebrating 97 Years**

The "Jewel" of Our Town

Some have said age is just a number. This "saying" is true for people over the age of 90. Meet Frances Albrecht Mayer, said to be the oldest Live Oak resident at the young age of 97. Frances was born on March 1, 1923, and still lives on what remains of her family farm. Her grandfather Albert Albrecht and grandmother Anna Beck planted their roots in Live Oak as farmers in the late 1800's. They built a two-bedroom, zero bathroom, farmhouse. Frances grew up in this farmhouse with her mother, father, 5 siblings and her grandparents.

Frances attended school at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Catholic School (OLPH) in Selma, Texas in the original two-room wood church. Before school each morning her dad would attach the horse to the buggy so the children could get to school, the oldest child would steer the cart and the horses were left at the corral at the school during the day. Frances attempted to tame and ride the family donkey on the farm but would find herself on the ground after many failed attempts. The summers were spent working on the farm, Frances taking care of the animals, feeding the pigs and chickens and collecting eggs each





day, and long days of picking cotton. Frances completed school in 1937 and soon got her first job away from the farm. Frances said "she couldn't wait to go to work as a nanny on RAFB because they had running water and indoor bathrooms."

Frances enjoys recalling the many memories of back in the day. She told us about the time the family got their first butter churner, the entire family would sit on the porch at night and the children would argue over who's turn it was to churn butter. As you can imagine after a few months there was no longer arguing as to who would churn the butter first.

In many conversations with Frances, one can hear her speak fondly about her brothers and how proud she was of their accomplishments. Frances' brother Clarence Albrecht was the first Mayor to serve the residents of Live Oak until 1966. Her brother Milton owned and operated the first Ice House and grocery store off IH35 in Live Oak. Clarence, along with his brothers Milton and Elgin Albrecht, and Melvin Mayer, France's late husband, and other politically minded residents of the area were instrumental in incorporating Live Oak as its own city during the time when San Antonio was attempting to incorporate the land as its own. The group named the new





city "Live Oak" after the many majestic oaks that populated the area at that time.

For many years, Frances worked at the Cookie Company to put her three sons through Central Catholic High School, then would eventually retire from Alamo Heights School District. After retirement, Frances would begin a new chapter in her life by staying home to help raise another generation of her family, by caring for her greatgrandchildren.

To celebrate Frances and her life's accomplishments, family and friends from nearby counties, to include her sons, her 7 grandchildren, and her 11 great-grandchildren all gathered at her home for cake and ice cream on March 1st. Frances' birthday wish was to simply enjoy her favorite holiday, Easter, and an acre filled with captivating bluebonnet and amazing spring weather. Family members say Frances may have celebrated her 97th birthday but being just three years from becoming a centenarian hasn't slowed her down or diminished her zest for life. One can still find Frances getting her hair styled weekly on Fridays, enjoying a meal from her favorite restaurant, and attending church on Sundays. Frances keeps busy by shopping with family members, and daily phone conversations with good friends while enjoying a cup of coffee. She especially loves the days when her



friend Mayor Mary Dennis stops in for a visit. Mary fills Frances in on the latest updates about the city or exchanges travel stories from a recent trip. "I will always respect, love and cherish the close friendship that I have with Mary," said Frances.

It was an absolute honor to highlight the "jewel" of our town that we call Frances Mayer in this edition of the

Hometown News. Live Oak will always keep the Albrecht/Mayer family legacy alive and Mayor Mary M. Dennis, City Council members, and staff looks forward to celebrating her in 2021 at her 98th birthday! A special thanks to her granddaughters and Ms. Frances for bringing us down memory lane by sharing her life's special moments and stories.

FIGHT OAR DIE




50 days, 11 hours and 35 minutes. This is how long it took a crew of four veterans to row across the Atlantic Ocean in the Talisker Whisky Challenge. One of these men was John Fannin, United States Marine Corps Veteran.

John was born in 1986 in New Jersey but his parents moved back to Texas when he was just a toddler, settling into a home on Greycliff in Live Oak. John went on to attend Live Oak Elementary, Kitty Hawk Middle School and graduated from Judson High School. He felt a calling and enlisted as an infantryman in the Marine Corps 3rd Battalion 7th Marines.

During his four year service, Fannin was deployed twice to the city of Ramadi, once in 2005 and again in 2007. When his time in the Marines was complete, John found himself to be adrift. He didn't quite know what he wanted to do or where he wanted to go in life, and he began to feel the effects of his combat military service. Suddenly, PTSD was very real and John was caught up in a pattern of helplessness which led to his attempting suicide. Fortunately, his story does not end here and John is a SURVIVOR. He reached out to the VA and began working on his mental health, fighting his way back and finding his place.

John pressed forward, graduating from Texas Lutheran University and became a volunteer firefighter in McQueeney. When Hurricane Harvey hit the Houston area, he immediately felt called to put his military skills and swift water rescue







certification to use. He had been in therapy for a while at this point and he said as ironic as it sounds, when Harvey hit, it gave him purpose and the opportunity for change that he had been seeking.

Change would certainly come as Fannin embarked on the adventure before him. Four strangers, thrust together for only a few weeks to train for one of the biggest events in their lives. On the water day after day with miles of ocean in front of them, John said you must make a commitment to just show up every day...the same in life. Some days you might row 75 miles and other days only 30, but slow and steady wins the race. Just show up EVERY DAY.

When asked why he would want to participate in something as grueling, as mentally and physically demanding as the Talisker Whisky Atlantic Challenge John said he felt like he had one more thing in life to prove; one more experience that would round him out and prepare him for the next stage in life.

He wanted people to know that if they are going through a hard time "There is a way out of this, there is hope, there is a beautiful life on the other side of your pain." Fannin says people will ask him how he knows all this, how he can be sure there is something better ahead and he tells them that he lived it and is here today as proof.

The Live Oak Pool will be open from 1 - 6:45 pm on Memorial, Day May 25th and will open for regular season on Saturday, May 30th.



### Live Oak Telecommunications THEN & NOW

Less than 65 years ago, police dispatch call centers that we see today didn't exist. From teletype communications to emails, text, and now real-time electronic chat, the technology that makes up the modern dispatch center has come a long way in relatively a shot time. The startup of dispatch services for Live Oak's police and fire departments were provided by the city of Universal City for years. In 1981, Live Oak would establish a dispatch service center of their own with hiring three dispatchers to work shifts covering days, swing, and midnights. In 1988, the dispatch center relocated in what is now the Public Works building.

The new center would be equipped with two modern radio consoles, three fulltime dispatchers, and four part-time personnel. Live Oak would not only be able to provide telecommunications for Live Oak but also provided services to fire the cities of Selma, Converse, and Judson I.S.D.

Fast forward to 2003. Dispatch relocated again into the newly constructed fire department. The fire station remains Live Oak Telecommunications Center's location even today. The 2003 upgrade included being equipped with three consoles, adding a supervisor, and hiring a total of nine full-time dispatchers. As the technology



changed over time, the dispatch center received a few minor upgrades in 2011 with a complete new radio system/911 consoles and upgrades to the landline telephone system.

We are pleased to announce that in March 2020, the center welcomed new modifications to accommodate four brand new consoles. The consoles are designed and manufactured by a company who specializes in public safety environments. The consoles have all steel frame and panels that are outfitted with height adjustments desktops, personal comfort system with heat, air, and blue ambient lighting with desktop controllers. The work surfaces are height adjustable and made with ergonomic urethane with an added edge treatment. The glass etching adds a unique identifier to the newly upgraded Dispatch Center.

#### CONSERVATION

Conservation starts with you. It is easy to take this precious resource for granted. Please think about the many ways you can conserve in your daily use of water. Handheld watering is allowed any time, any day. When watering your plants, trees and lawn please follow the rules listed below:

Year-Round watering restrictions with an irrigation system or hose and sprinkler is permitted any day of the week any time before 11 a.m. or after 7 p.m.

- Stage 1: Irrigation or sprinkler watering 1 day per week at any time before 11 a.m. or after 7 p.m.
- Stage 2: Irrigation or sprinkler watering 1 day per week from 7-11 a.m. or 7-11 p.m.
- Stage 3: Irrigation or sprinkler watering only 1 day every other week.
- Last Digit of Address determines your watering day: 0 or 1 = Monday; 2 or 3 = Tuesday; 4 or 5 = Wednesday; 6 or 7 = Thursday; 8 or 9 = Friday. No watering on weekends.

Fireworks and celebrations usually go together, especially during special events and holidays. However, they are not safe in the hands of consumers when used improperly. Fireworks



Friendly Reminder

Just a friendly reminder from the City of Live Oak Code Enforcement office to please keep all trees hanging over streets cut to a minimum of 13.6 feet in height, and over sidewalks cut to a minimum of eight (8) feet in height. Section 302.4 of the City's Code of Ordinances does not allow trees to grow below these heights listed.

We want to ensure that our citizens have plenty of room to walk and navigate through Live Oak and that any city services can navigate the streets safely and quickly!

Tip: If you are unsure of the height of your branches over the sidewalks/streets, please give us a call and we would be more than happy to check the branch heights. The Code Enforcement office can be reached at (210) 653-9140 ext. 2245.
