





The Man with Many Hats

Joseph "Joe" Painter

Most weekdays you would find Joseph "Joe" Painter running errands with his wife, attending a city meeting or even speaking at a ribbon cutting ceremony for a new business in town. On Saturdays, it was trips to Mexico to deliver food and supplies to orphanages as a mission for his church. On Sundays, well that was a day of worship for Joe and his wife Becky. All that visibility around town would end on Saturday, September 26th when Joe passed away quietly at his home surrounded by his loving family.

During his public service throughout the years for the city of Live Oak and the community, Joe had many roles. He was the Live Oak City Manager, Mayor and finally the Board President for the Economic Development Corporation (EDC). As a young man, Joe attended college in Beaverton, Oregon but soon was called to serve our nation. He served three years in the Army, which included a year of combat in Vietnam. After returning to the states, he finished his degree in Public Administration. Joe's first city job was as Assistant City Manager in Burlington, lowa, south of lowa City.

His public administration career would take him to numerous cities including Kennewick, Washington, where Joe became the President of the Oregon, Washington & Alaska City Management Association. During his tenure there, he was instrumental in bringing a professional ice hockey team of the Western Hockey League to Kennewick, Washington known as the Tri- City Americans.

Before moving to Live Oak, Joe also served as the City Administrator for Watertown, Massachusetts. Once he and his family arrived in Texas, he went straight to work as Live Oak's new City Manager utilizing his talents in finance and economic development to the fullest. Three huge accomplishments that are partly accredited to Joe and his administration are the Forum Shopping Center, Live Oak's disc golf course and being part of the initial conversations with IKEA.

After finally making the decision to retire from Live Oak, Joe threw his hat into the political arena. He ran for Live Oak Mayor and won the election. Briefly coming out of retirement, he served as interim city manager for the cities of Castroville and Poteet. After these interim positions were filled, Joe involved himself with his life's passion of economic development. He applied as a volunteer to serve on the Live Oak Economic Development Corporation Board as a Citizen Director and eventually was elected and served as Board President. Joe happily served in that capacity until his death. The man with many hats along with his infectious laughter will be missed by all.







of the club. The focus and mission of the Club was always "community" involvement.

One of the first official community projects the new club did was to adopt a stretch of Judson Road as a beautification project. Members routinely picked up debris and trash along Judson Road while maintaining the grass along the curbs. Each member dedicated their weekends and some week nights by volunteering with the beautification project. The club kept busy within the community by also supporting city staff by working the concession stand selling snacks during the annual Park Appreciation Day in the City Park. This event would soon become one of their largest fundraisers over the years and the proceeds would go towards additional community projects that one can still see around the City today.

The Lions Club members decided they wanted to leave a legacy in the community. So they quickly became involved in funding projects that were needed in the park. They first renovated the concession stand, and funding a portion of the original "floating fishing pier" along with the assistance of Bass Pro Shop. Members were instrumental in funding and the installation of the first gazebo at lakeside and the initial flag pole at the Xeriscape Garden off of Toepperwein. Other community events the Club would find themselves involved in included the July 4th annual parade and the Shop Live Oak 5K.

sponsor that would leave a legacy for many generations to enjoy. They soon devised a legacy project that began with one memorial plaque recognizing veterans of the Korean War that stood along the breezeway between the old police department (now public works) and City Hall. The Club members saw the need to

properly display and to honor military personnel from all past military campaigns by relocating the single plaque to a better location. The dream of a unique public spot on city grounds for the living memorial garden would finally become a reality.




After purchasing second plaque honoring the veterans of WWII and choosing the new location, a dedication ceremony was held after the July 4th Parade in 2001 at the corner of Shin Oak and Oak Terrace in front of the fire station. On that day,

the location was dedicated and named the "Live Oak Memorial Garden." This spot has become a beautifully landscaped area for people to sit and honor our Veterans.

In 2002, the Club purchased the third Plaque to honor veterans from WWI and continued purchasing plaques of all succeeding military wars, conflicts, and campaigns. It would become a tradition each year for the Club to purchase a new plaque and to dedicate it after the parade. In 2003, the July 4th parade were no longer was hosted within the city, and future dedication ceremonies would be conducted after the annual Memorial Day parade. The plaques were designed, purchased and installed by members of the Live Oak Lions Club. Director of Public Works Mark Wagster realigned and moved the monuments along the newly constructed winding sidewalk. At the center of the sidewalk, a Texas star was etched into the concrete and are now surrounded by two etched concrete benches for visitors or walkers. The concrete benches were added in May of 2007.



Today, the campaigns honored at the site include WWI, WWII, Korean War, Vietnam, September 11th, Desert Storm, Desert Shield, Operation Enduring Freedom, Operation Iraqi Freedom, and Afghanistan & Iraq War.





The Memorial Garden is the very heartbeat and legacy the original twenty-two members of the Live Oak Lions Club wanted to leave behind. Under the guidance of the original members, and the considerable efforts of many volunteers, city staff and benefactors who have donated money, materials and lots of hard work, this beautiful garden serves as a living tribute to our Veterans. Although the beauty of the flowers and plantings around the Garden will change with the seasons, the beauty and honor of what the garden represents will not.

The memorials are visited by hundreds of Veterans and their families each year. It's a living tribute honoring the sacrifices made by our men and women of the military who have so gallantly served our nation. It is free to the public and available 365 days of the year. Visitors are always welcome! Candle Safety



From 2007-2011 U.S. fire departments responded to an estimated 10,630 home structure fires that were started by candles. These fires caused 115 deaths, 903 injuries and \$418 million in direct property damage. Candles caused 4% of reported home fires, 5% of home fire deaths, 7% of home fire injuries, and 6% of direct property damage from home fires during this period.

Facts and Figures

During the five-year period of 2007-2011:

Roughly one-third (36%) of home candle fires started in bedrooms.

On average, 29 home candle fires were reported per day.

Falling asleep was a factor in 11% of the home candle fires and 37% of the associated deaths. More than half (56%) of home candle fires occurred when some form of combustible material was left or came too close to the candle.

Fire Department – Thanksgiving Fire Safety Tips

Cooking is, by far, the leading cause of fires and fire-related injuries in residential buildings. Unattended cooking equipment is the leading factor contributing to the ignition of larger spreading cooking fires.

The highest incidence of cooking fires in residential buildings occurs on Thanksgiving Day, followed by Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

WATCH WHAT YOU HEAT!

Stay in the kitchen when you are frying, grilling or broiling food.

If you leave the kitchen for even a short period of time, turn off the stove.

If you are simmering, baking, roasting or boiling food, check it regularly and use a timer to remind you that you're cooking.

Have activities that keep kids out of the kitchen during busy time. Games, puzzles or books can keep them busy. Kids can get involved in Thanksgiving recipes that can be done outside the kitchen.

If you are traveling, remember to have a friend or neighbor watch your home and pick up any newspapers or packages that have been delivered to your door. If possible, have interior lights on a



Code Corner


Although your Code Compliance Department has many property maintenance codes to enforce, there are a few circumstances that Code Officers cannot assist homeowners with. Here are two of those circumstances considered to be civil matters.

Fences

Code Compliance can enforce fences in disrepair, but with certain conditions. Fences shared between neighbors, such as a side or back fence, would not be included in these conditions. For example, if you and your neighbor share a back fence that is in need of major repair this would be an issue to be handled between you and your neighbor. Code Compliance officers cannot require the fence to be repaired and/or require property owners to share repair costs. However, code enforcement can require fence repairs to any fences in need of repair that are visible from the street, right of way, or easement.

TIP:

With a quick discussion with your neighbor, you may end up working out a shared cost agreement for a new fence or repairs. This can make both homeowners happy and the fence will back incompliance.





Trees

Code Compliance does not have codes for tree maintenance between properties. The codes that our office enforces reference trees that hang over the street, sidewalk, or right of way only. If your neighbors' tree becomes troublesome with overhanging limbs on your roof, fence, or your property, you can ask the property owner to cut the limbs back. If the property owner refuses to cut the limbs, Code Compliance officers cannot require the owner to cut, or pay to have cut, the portion of their tree that is hanging over onto your property.

TIP:

As a property owner, you have the right to trim or cut any branches, limbs, or bushes that go over your property line without permission from the neighbor. You do not have to notify the tree owner that you will be cutting the portion of tree that is hanging over onto your side of the property line. Please note, you cannot go onto the neighbor's property to cut the limbs of the tree or bushes for any situation without their permission.

We hope this provided useful information regarding fences and trees. Our code of ordinances is available at www.LiveOakTX.net, where Section 302.7 describes fences and Section 302.4 describes weeds, grass and limbs. The City of Live Oak's Utility/Storm Water department performs cleaning and maintenance activities on the drainage channels and pipes in city easements & rights-of-way in accordance with an established schedule and other standard operating procedures. Residents are encouraged to assist in maintaining the drainage in their areas by removing or reporting obstructions (such as tree limbs, leaves, debris, trash, etc.). Keeping drainage channels free of obstructions reduces flooding in the event of heavy rains. By way of city ordinance, it is illegal to dump trash, leaves, landscape debris, paint, grease, or any other material into any portion of the city's drainage system. Such dumping can have devastating impacts on water quality in addition to causing To report obstructions or illegal flooding. dumping, or for questions regarding drainage system maintenance, please contact Storm Water Maintenance at (210) 653-9140, ext. 2224.



Permitting Requirements

Did you know that all development within the city requires a permit? Always check and fulfill permitting requirements with the Development Services department at (210) 653-9140, extension 2244, before you build on, alter, fill, or re-grade on any portion of your property and/or within any easement or right-of-way. This construction or re-grading may alter the flow of water during a flood causing damage or backup to your home or your neighbor's home. Also, contact the number above to report any suspected permitting violations.

- 5. Materials are taken to a facility, then sorted and sent to be recycled and/or disposed of properly.
