



HOLIDAY SEASON IS FIRE SEASON

Stay in the kitchen while cooking Don't leave candles unattended Keep your Christmas tree well watered

It still feels warm outside now but winter is just around the corner. Statistics show that more cooking is done indoors during the winter and extraordinary measures are sometimes taken to keep the family and house pets warm. As such, the Fire Department would like to offer some safety suggestions for the 2016 Holiday Season.



Electrical Safety:

- Check all cords and light bulbs for damage or loose bulbs prior to decorating the house and Christmas tree.
- Do NOT overload electrical circuits. Check the manufacturer's recommendations for the number of cords per outlet.
- If you use a multi-outlet adapter to connect several cords together, check to make sure it is circuit breaker protected and not just surge protected.

Candle Safety:

- All candles should be placed on a flat, level, sturdy surface.
- Be careful not to place anything that can burn within 12-inches of any candle and certainly do not place anything that can burn above a candle.
- Always extinguish candles when leaving the house or leaving the room to sleep.
- It is safer to use battery operated candles to minimize the candle dangers.

Cooking:

- Remain in the kitchen when cooking on the cooktop. Do not leave food cooking unattended.
- Keep all combustibles a minimum of 3 feet from all heat sources. This includes children and pets.
- Remember to keep the lid to the pan close by when cooking even if you will not need it as part of the cooking process to extinguish grease fires easily.
- If a fire starts in the oven, don't panic. Close the oven door and turn off the heat. The fire will extinguish itself.

Christmas tree and Decorations:

- Select a tree that appears healthy and doesn't have a lot of needles falling off when shaken.
- Fresh trees need to be watered daily.
- When placing lights & decoration on the tree, make sure the combustible decorations are not touching a light bulb. Even those miniature lights get hot.
- Check all artificial trees for testing labels such as UL.

PRESERVING OUR PARKS Celebrating Arbor Day!

Many trees in the Main Park have a short life expectancy due to pests and diseases. Terry Mayfield and Wayne Trammel from our Parks Department saw there was a need to plant more trees in the park to ensure the city would have healthy trees and a wonderful habitat for people and wildlife for generations to come. To achieve this goal, they collected seeds, solicited tree donations and gathered information from area organizations



such as Texas A&M Forestry Services, Lake View College, San Antonio River Authority, International Society of Arboriculture, Acorn Project of Crestview Elementary, employees and you, the citizens of Live Oak.

The goal was to grow a variety of trees to plant in the City Parks and to supply trees for adoption each year at our Arbor Day event. Terry and Wayne set out to achieve their set goals by creating a small tree



propagation farm behind at the park facility. In the year of the tree farm's existence, approximately 700 trees have been propagated. The trees will be allowed to grow to the height of 4 to 6 feet before planting to ensure a better survival rate. Currently, they have plant sizes ranging from seedlings up to 10 gallon pots. The City usually budgets enough to buy and plant approximately twenty trees per year. This tree project will save the City a considerable amount of money while also supplying a larger volume of healthy trees to our community parks and surrounding city facilities.

The tree inventory is being increased to include a variety of regional trees consisting of twelve (12) hardwood, twelve (12) ornamental and fruit tree varieties. To better manage the labor of watering, staff installed a drip line irrigation system in several areas of the tree farm.



Whether they are at work, a restaurant, a park, a hospital or cemetery, Wayne and Terry are always collecting seeds. If all goes well, the benefits of the Live Oak Tree Farm will ensure a healthy urban forest for the City of Live Oak for many generations to enjoy.

"Longtime Resident Finds New Home"

> Some of you may know this beautiful lady that roamed the streets for quite some time known as "Mama Dog" finally found a home. Mama Dog spent 14 months running the streets of Live Oak before finally being apprehended by ACO's Derrick and Terry.

As one of the smartest dogs on the streets, she knew where to go and knew where to hide to avoid animal

control. In the 14 months that Mama Dog ran the streets, she had two litters of puppies at two different locations which were discovered in residential backyards. As all good moms do, Mama Dog found the safest places to give birth to her puppies. Even though she was a great mother, she couldn't keep her puppies from revealing her secret locations. Her first location was on Moss Hollow underneath a resident's shed, who heard the sounds of whimpering and barking. On January 30, 2015, eleven puppies were rescued by ACO Derrick and ACO Cathy from underneath this shed. An attempt was made to apprehend Mama Dog, but with her ninja-like skills she managed to sneak by us, but not before biting through ACO Derrick's jacket and ACO Terry's pant leg. With her puppies' safe and sound at our facility, we did not give up in trying to locate Mama Dog. After tracking her for several months, we discovered she was pregnant again. With a strategy in place, on November 3, 2015, Mama Dog and her second litter were finally apprehended from a resident's back yard on Far West. Mama Dog was finally safe and off the streets in our facility where she was fed twice a day, safe from the elements and reunited with her pups.

The Humane Society of Live Oak donated money to get Mama Dog fully vetted in hopes to find her a home or a rescue. With the help of hometown hero Hilda Lafredo, on September 2, 2016, Mama Dog found a fur-ever home in Marion with plenty of room to run and play with horses, chickens and other dogs.






