

Let's end the streak





Junior Police Academy

The Live Oak Police Department once again had a very successful Junior Police Academy. The Junior Academy was held June 17 - 21, 2019. We had a total of 39 cadets, and we had 3 former cadets that returned and volunteered as team leaders. All junior cadets went through an orientation and expectations session. They were able to run the police officer's obstacle course to learn some of the physical demands of a police officer. They listened to talks about bullying, internet safety, drugs, peer pressure and other life obstacles, learning how to avoid them and how to deal with them when confronted.



The cadets learned how to process criminal evidence, take detailed notes, photograph and lift fingerprints. They also learned about how K-9 teams work. In addition, the cadets also got to have some fun with less lethal weapons such as tasers, bean bag rounds, pepper ball rounds and seeing how they affect people. The cadets learned valuable lessons such as respect for themselves and others, honesty and compassion for others. By the end of the week it was hard to tell who had more fun, the cadets or the officers. I would like to give special thanks to Sergeant William Feldtmose for once again organizing this academy class as well as all the police officers who stepped in to teach the classes.



Move Over Slow Down

The "Move over Slow Down" law has been in effect in the state of Texas since September 1, 2003. The law requires that all motorists on approaching a stationary authorized emergency vehicle using visual signals (emergency lights), shall vacate the lane closest to the emergency vehicle when driving on a highway with two or more lanes traveling in the same direction of the emergency vehicle or slow to a speed not to exceed 20 MPH less than the posted speed limit when the posted speed limit is 25 MPH or more or slow to a speed of 5 MPH if the posted speed limit is less than 25 MPH. Emergency vehicles include police, fire, EMS, tow trucks, TXDOT vehicles.

Kendall County Deputy Carlos Ramirez lost his life on July 2, 2019 due to this very thing. A thoughtless driver ignored this law, hit the Deputy's patrol vehicle and killed him. What could possibly be so important that a driver wouldn't move over and slow down that would make someone risk the life of another or kill another. There is no answer. Move over and slow down!



Texas Reclassifies Public Safety Telecommunicators as First Responders

For many years Public Safety Telecommunicators known to most as 911 dispatchers, have been fighting to be recognized as first responders. Until recently Public Safety Telecommunicators have been classified as clerical workers, even though the State requires them to obtain licensing much like Police, Fire, and Medical personnel. As a result of this inaccurate classification they were not afforded the same benefits and protections under state law as other first responders.

Public Safety Telecommunicators provide critical and often life-saving services to the public and various agencies, which encounter stressful and traumatic events in the course of their duties. The work they perform goes far beyond merely relaying information between the public and first responders. The initial information obtained and actions taken by Public Safety Telecommunicators form the foundation for an effective response and can prevent the situation from getting worse.

During active shooter incidents, Public Safety Telecommunicators coach callers through first aid and give advice to prevent further harm, all while collecting vital information to provide situational awareness for responding officers. They are often communicating with people in great distress, harm, fear, or injury, while employing their experience and training to recognize a critical piece of information. When police officers, firefighters, and EMTs are being shot at, their calls for help go to Public Safety Telecommunicators. In fact, there have been incidents in which Public Safety Telecommunicators have prevented serious harm or death of law enforcement officers who would have otherwise walked into a trap.

Research has suggested that Public Safety Telecommunicators are exposed to trauma that may lead to the development of posttraumatic stress disorder due to the around-the-clock nature of the job. Recognizing the risks associated with exposure to traumatic events, some agencies including Live Oak provide Critical Incident Stress Debriefing (CISD) teams to lessen the psychological impact and accelerate recovery for Public Safety Telecommunicators and first responders, alike.

Governor Gregg Abbott signed House Bill 1090 to take effect September 1st reclassifying Public Safety Telecommunicators as First Responders in Texas. Texas is one of the few states in the nation to recently make this change. On a national level, as of July 2019, an amendment has been passed in the House of Representatives which would reclassify Public Safety Telecommunicators as "first responders" in the Federal Government. It is called the 911 Saves Act H.R. 1629; classifying as Protective Service Occupations, as opposed to administrative clerical occupations in the Federal government's Occupation status.

While this is just the beginning of this bill being passed in congress, it is a step in the right direction. If you would like to support this effort contact your state representative and ask them to sponsor the bill.



10 FIRE SAFETY TIPS FOR KIDS Please share these Fire Safety tips with the kids you know

KIDS: Do you know what to do if there is a fire? Here are 10 fire safety tips for kids that will help you prevent a fire in your home, and stay calm and safe in an emergency:

- 1. Don't play with matches. In fact, don't even pick them up. If you find matches or a lighter on the floor, be sure to tell an adult. This goes for lit candles, too.
- Check your house for smoke detectors. There should be at least one on every floor of your home. And ask you parents when the batteries were last changed. Most fire departments recommend changing batteries twice a year — in the fall when you set clocks back and in the spring when you set them forward.
- 3. Check your house for fire hazards. Fireplaces and electrical cords should be checked regularly to make sure they are in good working order. If there is an adult in the home who smokes, make sure that he disposes of his ashes frequently in a heavy metal container.
- 4. Make a family fire safety plan. What should you do if you hear the smoke alarm in the middle of the night? Talk to your family about where you should go and what you should all do in the event of a fire. There should be two ways to escape from every room (in case one way is blocked by fire.) And you should pick a location outside a neighbor's house, a big tree, a nearby park where everyone can meet.
- 5. Practice your fire safety plan. Don't just talk about it —run through your plan to make sure everyone knows what to do. Check windows and screens to make sure that they will open if necessary. And practice meeting up at your assigned location outside.
- 6. If there is a fire in your home, remember this important fire safety tip: Don't hide, go outside! You may be scared, but never hide during a fire. Get outside and wait for your parents or caregivers at your assigned spot.

- 7. The best way to escape in the event of a fire is to fall and crawl. Get low to the ground where there is less smoke in the air and crawl your way to safety.
- 8. If your clothes are on fire, don't panic. Remember to stop, drop and roll. Keep rolling until the fire is out. Don't run it will make the fire spread faster.
- 9. Never go back inside a burning building. You made a fire safety plan with your family, now stick to it! Once you get to the designated meeting spot, stay there and wait for your family to arrive.
- 10. Know your emergency phone numbers. Call 9-1-1 in the event of an emergency. You should also know the number for a nearby emergency contact (a relative, friend, or neighbor) who can respond quickly if your family needs help.

DON'T BE STUMPED! Bulky Trash Pick-Up


The semi-annual Bulky Trash Pick Up begins September 30, 2019. Please follow the guidelines below to have your large, unwanted "treasures" picked up:

- Place bulky items along the curb by Sunday evening, September 29th
- Examples of acceptable bulky items include: chairs, sofas, tables, water heaters, and lawn furniture.
- The following items are unacceptable and will not be picked up: No brush, No televisions, No computers, No monitors, No refrigerators, No window units, No portable air conditioners or anything that contains Freon, No tires, and No batteries.
- Items cannot be placed at the curb before Tuesday, September 24th.
- Waste Management will only pass by once. Please remember not to cover the sidewalk or water meter with your items, and do NOT park along the curb near the bulky items.

Don't Be Stumped by Live Oak's **Brush Service**

Waste Management offers a monthly curbside brush collection service for residents that trim their own trees. If you plan to use this service, then please carefully follow the guidelines listed below.

- No Brush Service during the months of April and October due to Bulky Trash Pick Up.
- Know your zone: Live Oak is divided into two sections for brush collection gold and green (See Attached Map).
- Collection of the gold area will begin on the first Thursday of the month, and collection of the green area will begin on the third Thursday of the month.
- Brush must be out prior to the pickup day. Waste Management will only pass thru each street of the scheduled area one time.
- Do not place your brush out more than a few days before your collection day.



Limit the size of your brush pile: The tree and shrub trimmings must be less than or equal to maximum of (12") twelve inches in diameter and the pile shall not exceed a maximum of (12') twelve feet in length, (5') five feet in height, and (5') five feet in width. Brush piles larger than the maximum size will not be picked up. See the illustration below:

- Place your brush pile on grass between the curb and sidewalk. Do not cover your water meter.
- Do not park any vehicles near the brush pile. •
- The brush collection service is not available for trees trimmed by a tree service, contractor, or yard laborer.
- Seal all tree wounds within 30 minutes of pruning or cutting.

In addition to curbside brush collection Waste Management will collect brush that is cut and bundled on your second pick up day of the week. Bundles cannot exceed (4') four feet in length and (35lbs) thirty five pounds in weight.

BRUSH AND STUFF

The city of Live Oak contracts with Waste Management to provide both BRUSH pick up and BULK pick up services. Brush pick up happens once a month and should not be confused with the twice a year bulk pick up. Think of brush as, well, just brush. Bulk is all the other stuff we need to get rid of. There are some rules to follow for both services:

BRUSH

Waste Management provides brush pickup for the residents of Live Oak once per month. The City is divided into two zones, Gold and Green:

GOLD ZONE - Collection of the Gold Zone begins the first Thursday of every month. Area begins at Judson Road and IH 35 and includes Retama Hollow, Brentwood Oaks, Bridlewood and Lookout Road. Also includes original Live Oak North of Leafy Hollow.

GREEN ZONE - Collection of the Green Zone begins the third Thursday of every month. Area includes all of Woodcrest and original Live Oak South of and including Leafy Hollow.

Waste Management will pass through each street only once, all brush must be placed curbside prior to the first day of scheduled pickup. The tree and shrub trimmings must be less than or equal to 12 inches (12") in diameter and the pile may not exceed 12 feet (12') in length, 5 feet (5') in height and 5 feet (5') in width. As a reminder, Waste Management is not responsible for the collection of work completed by contractors. Tree removal and extensive tree trimming is the responsibility of the homeowner.

BULK

Semi-Annual Bulk Pickup - Items you plan to put out for Bulk Pickup must not be put out until after the city wide garage sale weekend. Pick up is scheduled twice a year in the spring and in the fall. Watch for dates in the newsletter and on the marquees. Bulk pick up can NOT include T.V.'s, refrigerators, or tires. Important Points to remember:

- Brush and Bulk pick up are separate services and the two piles must NOT be combined.
- Brush pile size is ALWAYS limited to 12' X 5' X 5'.
- Your pile should be at your address. Do not combine piles from several addresses.
- Bulk and brush must not block streets, sidewalk, meters, or cut off valves.
- day the truck makes it to your house.

Waste Management also provides special pick-ups for Household Hazardous Waste and an E-Cycle service for things like T.V.'s and electronics which may contain hazardous components. Call 1.800.449.7587 to schedule your pick up of these items.

For additional questions, please call Waste Management Customer Service at 800-800-5804. Bushes and trees tend to regrow when you cut them and we all tend to accumulate too much stuff. These services are a great way manage your brush and stuff. Be a good neighbor and help keep Live Oak beautiful!




