After being at the Animal Control facility for 16 months, Sammy made his appearance at an adoption event where he locked eyes with his adopter. You'll find loads of helpful information online about permit fees and the city requirements and procedures to minimize any frustration. Development Services has fine-tuned the process of pulling permits by making it easier and more efficient for anyone to follow. Contractors and residents now have the ability to apply for permits from the comfort of an office or home computer. If you are a homeowner with a homestead exemption, you are now eligible to pull permits. The process is simple and we will accept all major credit cards for payments over the phone with the exception of American Express. An inspection may also be requested from the same account on-line. You are now able to view a visual tutorial on how to access our new permitting process from our city web-site at

#### **STORMWATER POLLUTION SOLUTIONS THANK YOU FOR DOING YOUR PART!**



What is Stormwater Runoff? Stormwater runoff occurs when precipitation from rain flows over the ground. Impervious surfaces like driveways, sidewalks, and streets prevent stormwater runoff from naturally soaking into the ground.

Why is Stormwater Runoff a Problem? Stormwater can pick up debris, chemicals, dirt, and other pollutants

and flow into a storm sewer system or directly to a lake, stream or river. Anything that enters a storm sewer system is discharged untreated into the waterbodies we use for swimming, fishing and providing drinking water.

#### What Can I Do To Help?

Don't overwater your lawn. Consider using a soaker hose instead of a sprinkler. Compost or mulch yard waste. Don't leave it in the street or sweep it into storm drains or streams. Cover piles of dirt or mulch being used in landscaping projects. Recycle or properly dispose of household products that contain chemicals, such as insecticides, pesticides, paint, solvents, and used motor oil and other auto fluids. Don't pour them onto the ground or into storm drains. Instead Live Oak Residents can call **1-800-449-7587** for household hazardous waste disposal (including batteries, fluorescent light bulbs and electronic waste).

#### DON'T LET DAK MILT KILL LIVE DAK'S TREES

PAINT all wounds to the trunk, limbs and root system of oak trees that expose sapwood within thirty minutes of the wound with



asphaltic or exterior oil or latex based paint.

#### SS SAVE SS Conserve Water. Every Drop Water. Counts.

Repair leaking faucets, nozzles, pipes, and toilets. Only water your lawn and garden in the evening or early morning. Use mulch around plants and shrubs to help retain moisture. Sweep clippings and leaves instead of using the hose.

In celebration of **Fire Prevention Week**, **October 9-15**, the Live Oak Fire Department would like to pass on basic fire prevention tips to assist you during the colder months ahead. Each year, fires that are caused by improper disposal of hot coals or ashes from fireplaces, wood stoves, pellet stoves, grills or mobile fireplaces designed for use on decks or patios become a safety concern.



#### TO PROPERLY DISPOSE OF ASHES OR COALS WE RECOMMEND THE FOLLOWING:

- If possible, allow ashes and coals to cool in the area where you had the fire for several days. These devices are designed to contain their heat safely.
- When it is time to dispose of the ashes, transfer them to a metal container and wet them down.
- Keep the metal container outside your home and away from any combustibles until the refuse is hauled away.
- DO NOT place any other combustibles in the metal container.
- DO NOT use a combustible container.

#### **MORE FIREPLACE SAFETY TIPS**

- Have your chimney inspected annually and cleaned as necessary by a professional chimney sweep to ensure it is clear of obstructions and creosote.
- Repair any cracks in your chimney and fireplace.
- Use fireplace screens to keep sparks and fire debris inside the fireplace.
- Do not use an accelerant to start a fire.
- Ensure the fire is completely out before going to bed or leaving the house.
- Make sure the area around the fireplace is clear of all combustibles (Three feet away is a good rule).
- Keep all children and pets a safe distance from fireplaces.
- Install both smoke and carbon monoxide alarms.
- Keep a fire extinguisher on hand.
- Observe all safety precautions when using outdoor fireplaces, they can be just as dangerous as indoor units.

**The fact** is that coals and ashes from fires can remain hot enough to start a fire for many days after you think the fire is out. The exact amount of time for complete extinguishment and cooling depends on many factors such as how hot the fire was, what was burning, how much unburned fuel remains, etc. **To be safe**, simply treat all ashes and coals as hot, even when you think they've had time enough to cool. www.nfpa.org/education ©NFPA 2016


