
UPDATE FROM THE LIVE OAK ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER DERRICK FRANCIS

The whole family was placed on a month hold and treated for mange. When Ella and her family appeared to be finally ready for adoption, staff discovered they all had ringworms. They were placed on hold for an additional three weeks. Luckily for Ella she already had a forever home waiting for her when she fully recovered. On November 18th she was finally able to join her new owners to begin her new adventure.

was a stray kitten found in Converse that was brought to our facility. Pepper had a minor case of upper respiratory infection, but with the help of Mrs. Hilda Lafredo (Homes for Pets); she quickly recovered and was given a clean bill of health. Staff received an email from a person who had seen her profile on one of the pet rescue sites. The family had a daughter that wished for a kitten as a pet for a very long time. Pepper was adopted by the family and she was given to the daughter for her birthday right before the Christmas holiday. Pepper was the best birthday gift ever!

Simba was owner surrendered after his owner had a medical emergency and had no one to care for him. Simba was scared and depressed. Over time, Simba warmed up to staff and really became known as a "chatter box." After having Simba for several weeks, we were able to contact his original owner and he agreed that it would be in Simba's best interest for staff to find him a new forever home. With the help of Mrs. Hilda Lafredo (Homes for Pets), a home was found for Simba in Houston. Simba now has a brother named "Bear." The two of them are inseparable.

Parther has been our shelter cat for almost a year. He was also owner surrendered to us from a resident of San Antonio, who due to circumstances was unable to keep him. Panther loved to walk around the facility rooms and the offices. He also loved playing hide and go-seek in Animal Control officer Derrick's desk drawer. We are happy to report that Panther has finally been adopted by a family that also adopted a new sister cat. He's living the life with his new family on the fifth floor of an apartment complex overlooking a golf course.



Speckles was brought in by a resident found in Universal City near the Meadows apartments. She wasn't at our facility for long before she was seen on our Facebook page and on Adopt-a-pet from a resident of Marion. We received an email from a lady who was interested in seeing Speckles and spending some time with her. Our staff at the Live Oak Animal Care and Control Facility would like to encourage you to look into pet adoption. At our facility, there are many sweet, loving animals that need a place to call home. Not only is the process for adoption easy and convenient, you will be providing a loving and safe home for an animal that so desperately deserves one.

THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT PET LICENSES

If you already own a cat or dog over three months of age and reside in Live Oak, please remember to obtain a pet license from us. For pets with proof of their annual rabies vaccination, the fee is \$5.00 for non-sterilized dogs and cats. Licenses for spayed or neutered dogs and cats are only \$2.00. If your pet is spayed/neutered and micro-chipped, the license is FREE! Licensing not only aids the Animal Care and Control staff with the pet population in Live Oak, but it allows for easy and quick reuniting of families with their lost pet.




Please Adopt Me!

CITY OF LIVE OAK VOLUNTEER/COMMUNTIY SERVICE RELEASE

The undersigned desires to participate as a volunteer in a program operated by the City of Live Oak (City).

In consideration of the City allowing my volunteer participation, I ______, hereby release, waive, discharge and covenant not to sue the City, its officers, servants, agents, employees and insurers, including but not limited to the Texas Municipal League Intergovernmental Risk Pool (hereinafter referred to as "releasees") from any and all liability, claims, demands, actions and causes of action whatsoever arising out of or relating to any loss, damage or injury, including death, that may be sustained by me, or to any property belonging to me, whether caused by the negligence of the releases, or otherwise, while participating in the activities, or while in, on or upon the premises where the activities are being conducted, while in transit to or from the premises, or in any place or places connected with the activities.

I understand that the volunteer work will require some physical effort (bending, lifting, walking, kneeling, etc.) and the use of small hand tools; supplies will be provided by the homeowner. I am in good health and able to acknowledge these conditions. I am fully aware of risks and hazards connected with being on the premises and participating in the activities, and I am fully aware that there may be risks and hazards unknown to me connected with being on the premises and participating in the activities, and I hereby elect to voluntarily participate in the activities, to enter upon the designated premises and engage in activities knowing that conditions may be hazardous, or may become hazardous or dangerous to me. I voluntarily assume full responsibility for any risks or loss, property damage or personal injury, that may be sustained by me, or any loss or damage to property owned by me, as a result of my being a participant in the activities, whether caused by the negligent of releasees or otherwise. I further hereby agree to indemnify and save and hold harmless the releasees and each of them, from any loss, liability, damage or costs they may incur due to my participation in the activities, whether caused by the negligence of any or all of the releasees, or otherwise. It is my express intent that this Release shall bind the members of my family and spouse, if I am alive, and my heirs, assigns and personal representative, if I am deceased, and shall be deemed as a Release, Waiver, Discharge and Covenant Not to Sue the above named releasees.

In signing this release, I acknowledge and represent that:

- A. I have read the foregoing release, understand it, and sign it voluntarily as my own free act and deed:
- B. No oral representation, statements or inducements, apart from the foregoing written agreement have been made;
- C. I am at least eighteen (18) years of age and fully competent or if a minor my parent(s) or guardian(s), by their signatures below, indicate they have fully read and understand this waiver and indicate, on behalf of their minor child, their full and unqualified consent to the terms of this waiver; and
- D. I execute this Release for full, adequate and complete consideration fully intending to be bound by same.
- E. I acknowledge that I will not be entitled to any compensation for my services, I will not be an employee of the City, and I will not be entitled to any benefits from the City.



F. I understand and agree that no particular hours of service are guaranteed for the volunteer work at with the City, that the City may determine at any time that is no longer needs such volunteer services performed, and that I may decide at any time to end my volunteer activities for the City.

It is my understanding that the City consents to having me participate in the program on public property. In the event entry is to be on private property, the City will first obtain the consent of the appropriate party to allow entry on private property.

It is my understanding that I am to provide my own transportation and supervision. In the event of any media coverage, it will be my personal responsibility to advise reporters whether or not I will agree to pictures or publication of my participation.

I agree and understand I shall receive no compensation for participating in the program, I will not receive any benefits from the City and I am not an employee of the City. I understand and agree that the work for this project will be completed under the direction of City personnel. I will be provided with a specific location or locations where work is to be done. To protect myself, my co-workers, and the public, I will follow safety precautions to the best of my ability.

Trash, Debris and High Grass

Even during the fall months, our grass and weeds still grow in South Texas. We ask that property owners continue to keep their grass below the twelve (12) inches in height established by our ordinance. Property owners and tenants are responsible for keeping their lawns mowed to the edge of the roadway. Those in violation who fail to comply by a courtesy notice request to mow are subject to having their property mowed by a City-hired contractor and the cost passed on to the owner. To help keep our city beautiful, we have hired a second code compliance officer. We have included both code compliance officers' contact information in the last paragraph of this article.

In addition, please help us keep the trash and debris that is accumulated in public view to a minimum. The fines for these violations are substantial and we ask that you do your part to make Live Oak a more beautiful city. These citations can be issued daily for the violation and the dollar amounts can be high. Homeowners can contact the Utility Department at 210-653-9140, extension 225 for dates on brush and bulk item pick-up.

Fences

Many times, fencing on a property is the most noticeable structure in terms of appearance. Our City's zoning regulations require property owners to maintain their fences in a reasonably plumb and structurally sound condition. Our Code Compliance department requires owners to remove, repair, or replace fences identified in violation. Each structural and decorative member of a fence shall be free of deterioration and be compatible in size, material and appearance with the remainder of the fence. A fence that has deteriorated to a condition that it is likely to fall shall be repaired or replaced. Fences shall not be externally braced in lieu of replacing or repairing posts, columns or other structural members. Residential fences may not exceed 6 feet unless they border a commercially zoned property.





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

Cheaper isn't always better! Watch Out for Contractor Scammens!

Choosing the right Contractor will be a decision you'll either regret or significantly appreciate. There is nothing in between! But how do you go about choosing the right contractors for your project?

You've come to the right place for information, because our department requires all contractors that work in our city to obtain a contractor's license and permit before they perform any work on your property. We verify the state issued licenses and liability insurance per city ordinance before they can obtain a Contractor's license. Before a contractor begins work on your property, ask to see their Live Oak permit, contractor's license, and obtain a signed copy of your contract. The 2016 City license has a green background with the city logo and indicates an expiration date of 02/01/2017. If a contractor tells you that a permit is not required for your particular job, you may always contact our office for verification.

Still, here are some tips to assist you in choosing the right Contractor:

- Tip #1 Ask to see their license card and Permit. Although the City of Live Oak also checks, you can double check at http://www.license.state.tx.us/LicenseSearch/
- Tip #2 Check references. Feedback posted for or against the company is an excellent place to start, but most businesses will also have written references if you request them. You may also check with the Better Business Bureau.
- Tip #3 Check your gut. For most people, a good electrician, plumber or mechanical contractor becomes your choice of contractors for life. Good contractors you enjoy dealing with or trust is as essential as a good bank.
- Tip #4 Check their range of experience. Although most contractors are experienced in a wide range of work, some companies can specialize and lose contact with the current technology over time. This wouldn't be relevant in most common jobs like window, siding, etc., but in some types of work it's worth confirming the business's experience is appropriate for your job.

Remember, unlicensed tradespeople operate with lower overheads (no license fees or insurance costs) so they may often charge less than a qualified tradesperson but could cost you more in the long run. If you would like to verify current licenses with the state or with the City of Live Oak, please contact our office at 210-653-9140, extension 244 or you may visit our website for a list of registered contractors at any time.
