The **MAYOR'S** CORNER


Dear Residents,







The Live Oak pool can only accept cash or personal checks, and no bills over \$20.00 are accepted. A summer pool pass can be purchased in the Public Works building beginning May 1st, and the cost is \$30.00 per person for residents, \$50.00 for non-residents. National Police Week

Child Safety - Look before you lock!



Summer is approaching and temperatures are on the rise. A motor vehicle parked in the sunlight can become an oven. With an ambient air temperature of 90 degrees, the interior of a vehicle can reach a temperature of 130 degrees in 30 minutes. Dashboards, steering wheels and seats can reach a temperature of 180 degrees over time. That heat then radiates throughout the vehicle. Heat stroke begins in the human body when the body temperature reaches a temperature of 104 degrees. Symptoms include: dizziness, disorientation, agitation, confusion, sluggishness, seizure, hot dry skin that is flushed but not sweaty, loss of consciousness, rapid heartbeat and hallucinations. These symptoms will eventually lead to death.

Parents and other caregivers need to be educated that a vehicle is not a babysitter nor play area. Never leave a child unattended in a vehicle. Not even for a few minutes while you run inside a convenience store. If you see a child inside a vehicle unattended call 911 immediately. Be sure that all occupants leave the vehicle when unloading. Don't overlook sleeping babies. Always lock your car and ensure children do not have access to keys or remote entry devices. Teach children that vehicles are never to be used as a play area. If a child is missing, always check the car including the trunk. Keep a stuffed animal in the child's car seat and when the child is put in the seat, place the animal in the front with the driver. Or, place your purse, briefcase or cell phone in the back seat as a reminder that you have your child in the car. Make "look before you lock" a routine whenever you get out of the car. Have a plan that your childcare provider will call you if your child does not show up for school.

New Contract Requirements

Most mechanical, electrical, and plumbing (MEP) improvements or repairs are performed under a contract. Legitimate businesses will usually insist upon having a contract for their own protection, and a well written agreement or contract should protect the homeowner, too. It is the most important communication tool for both the contractor and consumer. The contract you sign should be clear and concise and include the “who, what, where, when” and cost of your project. The signed contract, invoice or written proposal will now be required as part of the submittal during the permit application process to protect the homeowner and business owner. It will also assist staff in confirming the value of the proposed job and assessing the permit fee. With this requirement in place, the customer can clearly see the permit amount is consistent with the contract they have provided. The state requires certain information on a contract, invoice or proposal in addition to the cost of the job.


For instance, a plumber must have a “Responsible Master” Plumber’s license and the State Board of Plumbers contact information listed on their contract according to Section 1301.302 of the Plumbing License law. Mechanical and Electrical contractors must have their contact information, license number and TDLR’s contact information listed on their contract under TDLR 16 Texas Administrative Code, Chapter 75.71 (i) for mechanical and TDLR Administrative Code, Chapter 73.51 for electricians. However, a homeowner with a “homestead exemption” on their property may pull a permit for themselves without producing an invoice, contract or written proposal.

Have you ever wondered what happens behind the scenes to make your city run? The answer for all cities is the people working in Public Works. Once a year we pause to recognize the important contributions made to our way of life by the people working in public works. Please join us in celebrating National Public Works week May 20-26, 2018. The motto this year is **“THE POWER OF PUBLIC WORKS.”**

Please take a moment and reflect on some of the services provided by this department that we all take for granted every day.

- We get in our cars and depend upon sound and safe streets to get us where we need to go.
- We turn on our faucets to have high quality water pouring out for us to drink, bathe and cook.
- We flush our toilets to have this waste transported to a treatment plant many miles away.
- We carry our “smelly” trash from our homes to the curb and it gets carried away to the landfill.
- We flip on a switch to have instant light in our homes.
- We sleep through a rain storm as drainage channels and storm sewers keep flood water out of homes.
- We walk, jog, run, play, fish, skate, and relax in our wonderful parks, maintained by Public Works.



Live Oak has four primary divisions of city staff providing public works: Streets and Storm Water, Water and Wastewater, Parks Maintenance, and Fleet Services. Live Oak also depends upon regional partners such as CPS Energy, San Antonio River Authority, Cibolo Creek Municipal Authority, San Antonio Water System, and Waste Management to provide public works services.

Street and Storm Water Operations

Live Oak Public Works maintains over 50 miles of streets and 12 miles of storm water facilities. Most of the work is outdoors in all weather conditions and exposure to the elements. The nature of the work is physically demanding and some of the most dangerous work found in municipal government (including police, fire, and first responders).



This division of public works patches potholes and performs repairs on larger, isolated pavement failures. One of the most important street maintenance

activities involves sealing cracks in the pavement to keep rain water out of the base and subgrade. This process involves applying a rubberized fluid asphalt material at over 350 °F to fill the cracks.

This division maintains the storm water system by mowing earthen slopes and drains, removing sediment and debris from channels and culverts, and inspecting for



pollution prevention as well as structural damage. Another important storm water pollution prevention activity is street sweeping. Street sweeping keeps the streets clean and attractive by vacuuming the leaves and trash along the curb, but more importantly this operation prevents potential pollutants from washing from the street into the storm drains. Other work includes buildings and grounds maintenance, litter clean up, graffiti removal, and maintaining traffic signs, pavement markings, and traffic control devices.

Most Common Contaminants

Keep these common contaminants OUT of your recycling bin.



NO Recyclables in Plastic Bags

Empty loose recyclables in bin but leave the plastic bag out.



NO Food & liquids

Compost instead! Otherwise, it belongs in the trash.



NO Electronics & Small Appliances

Donate if in good condition, or schedule a bulky item pickup, if available. Check earth911.com for a local drop off site.



NO Textiles, Bedding, Rugs & Carpet

Donate these items if they are in good condition. Large quantities may require special disposal.



NO Hoses, Holiday Lights, Hangers & Extension Cords

They wrap around equipment and can shut down an entire facility! They all go in the trash.



NO Plastic Bags, Film/Sheeting & Flexible Film Packaging

Take plastic bags back to a local grocer to keep bags clean and dry, and prevent them from shutting down recycling facilities. Visit plasticfilmrecycling.org to find a drop off location near you.



NO Paper Napkins, Plates, Cups & Tissues

Compost if possible, and remember to recycle the cardboard tube.



NO Polystyrene Foam

Foam and plastic to-go containers are not recyclable curbside. Find drop off programs for items like foam packing peanuts at earth911.com



NO Tires, Auto Parts & Scrap Metal (Including Propane Tanks)

(Not in recycling or trash) Can damage equipment & are safety hazards. Contact local scrap recyclers or retail tire stores for

recycling options, or check earth911.com for a drop off center near you.



NO Concrete, Wood & Construction Debris

Can damage equipment & are safety hazards. You may be able to schedule a bulky item pickup - otherwise throw it in the trash or order a roll off bin by contacting Waste Management Customer Service.



NO Yard Waste & Wood

Compost or put in your yard waste cart, if available. Otherwise, it belongs in the trash.



NO Non-Recyclable Plastic

Not everything that is plastic is recyclable! Recycle only food & beverage bottles, jugs and tubs.

Listed below are items that cannot be placed in your residential container.

- Oil rags, etc. (any type of oily drilling waste)
- Electronic Waste (computers, computer accessories, televisions etc.) or CEDs (televisions, computers or video display devices with a screen that is greater than four inches measured diagonally)
- Tires
- Freon-containing Appliances (white goods)
- Hazardous waste
- Liquid waste
- Industrial waste
- Chemical products
- Oil filters (unless drained for 24 hours)

- Herbicides and pesticides




